- b Review of Board & Committee Structure
 - 1 Concern over communication at committee level
 - 2 Why don't more members want to be involved at the board level?
 - 3 Board decisions vs. Operational (staff) decisions still somewhat unclear
 - 4 Appointments vs elections creates a divide or uncertainty of if people feel their voice matters
 - 5 Could an ANNUAL meeting be helpful to hear from MORE members (26 of 120 club directors voted in the last election)???
 - 6 Should we review Advisory Committee which may be out dated due to Staff increase in size/competence; where does Staff need help???
 - 7 Can the voting members (geographic) become more involved and more of a voice for communities such as Adult, Beach, etc

 - 1 year exception, will work to have them register in Badger for 2020-2021 (satellite club/league)

 - 1 Placing bids for Women's D1 & D3 National Championships
 - Can we go for Men's D3 as well? 2022 Men's D3 Championship in Canton, OH may be in trouble (no facility yet)
 - 2 Jen to follow up with letter of support

VI Financial

- a Financial Status Review FY 18-19 & 19-20
 - 1 4.2% in membership
 - 2 167% increase in event entries
 - 3 Contractors/equipment rental savings for BRC
 - 4 More detailed/robust report to come in February
 - 5 Current Balance Sheet is strong
- b Investment Strategy Discussion
 - 1 What we are doing is working
 - 2 Should consider investing in D & O insurance and/or Staff and save for unexpected monumental expenses

VIIITournaments

- a Updates / Questions on events and tournaments
 - 1 BRPL (210 teams), may be some division shifts due to numbers not divisible by 4; will fluctuate after 15 & Up tryouts
 - 2 BRYFVL was a huge success; possible expansion in other areas of the state (Fox Cites, Kenosha/Racine)
 - 19 trained and on-court observation for officials
 - Net income \$60k (even after dropping entry fee)

a Questions on Officials Pre-Reads

b Special Olympics as a Ref Training Event

- Perception is that this is a Badger Region Event; it IS NOT a Badger Region sanctioned event (no insurance)
- 2 Offered as a low stress training environment
- 3 Do we want to continue support it? If so, how do we limit/reduce our liability
 - Must advertise as an option, but be VERY clear that this is NOT a Badger Region event
 - Training vs Mentoring does not matter, it is still not a Badger Region event (we are liable if we tell/ask them to come)
- 4 Independent Contractors should have individual insurance
- 5 Add a disclaimer on ZebraWeb to protect Region

6 Larry is comfortable no longer using as a training ground as other options are now available; Refs can continue to volunteer

c Coach at the Table Policy

- 1 Coaches wear many hats (recruiting, no assistant, etc)
 - Finding coaches is challenging enough as it is; parents are paying significant amount of money
- 2 Clarification of rostered adult (must be trained)
- Who polices and enforces (Region or Tournament Director)
- 4 Region policy for training coaches/players already exists, needs to be enforced; issue deadline, follow up with fines
 - Not enough Clubs properly trained; what about those that do train properly
- 5 Qualifiers & JVA World Challenge require it; should not be event specific, we always want the work crew to do a good job
- 6 Simplify the scoresheet (in progress at USAV level)
 - ELMO Kim, let's be more proactive vs reactive. Utilize individual webpoint/USAV Academy training
- 7 Send examples of poor scoresheets to Ref/Score Chair → require them to have a Jr Work Crew Clinic

d Ref Pay Increase Proposal

- 1 Hasn't been adjusted since 2014; neighboring regions are paying more
- 2 1 day vs. 2 day events (difference in pay/location, mileage, parking, etc); will refs stay "home" if pay is similar or the same?
- Why is this not being discussed in HR Committee (Independent Contractors) vs in general BOD meeting?
 - Recommendation should come from HR Committee
