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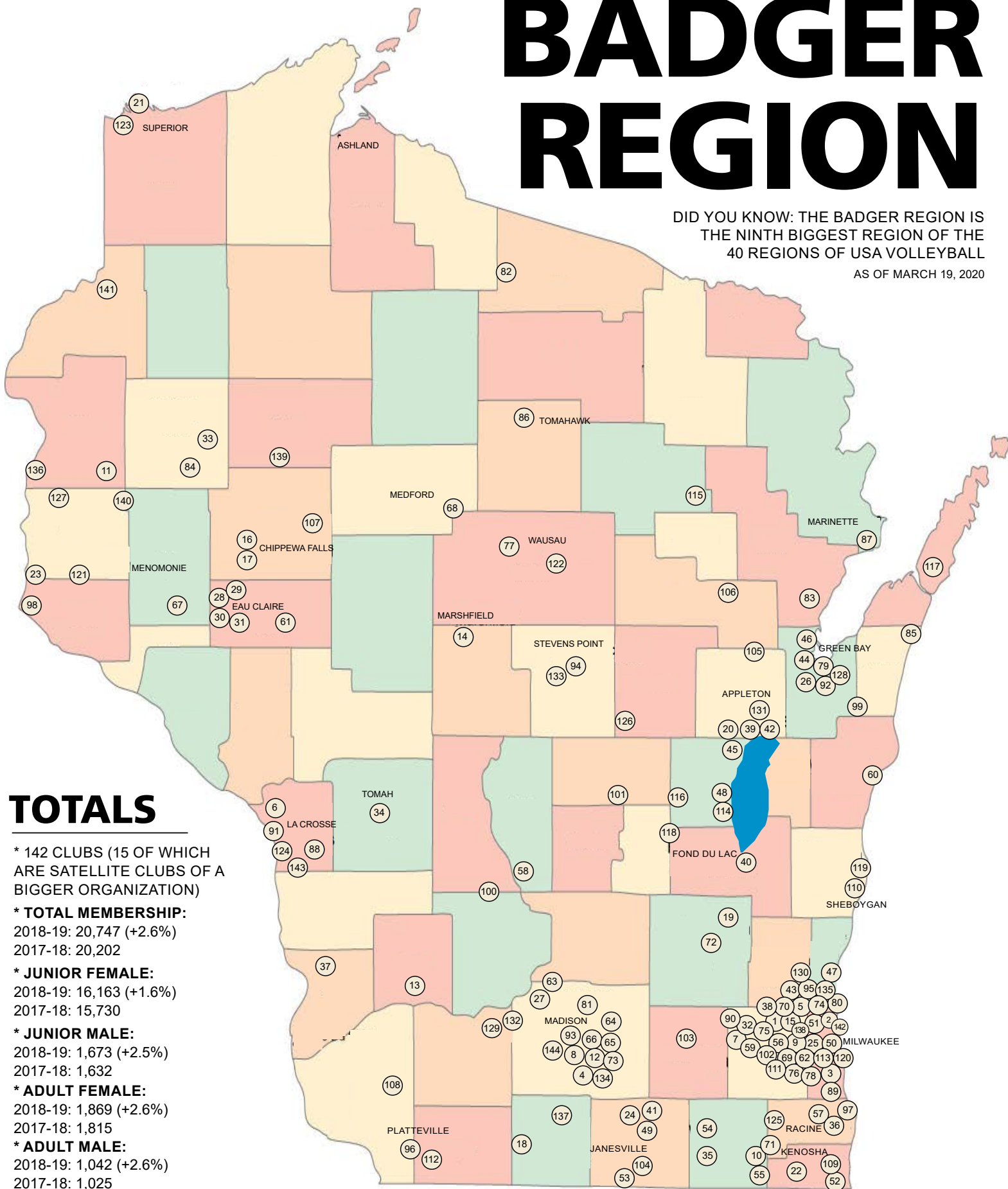

How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective

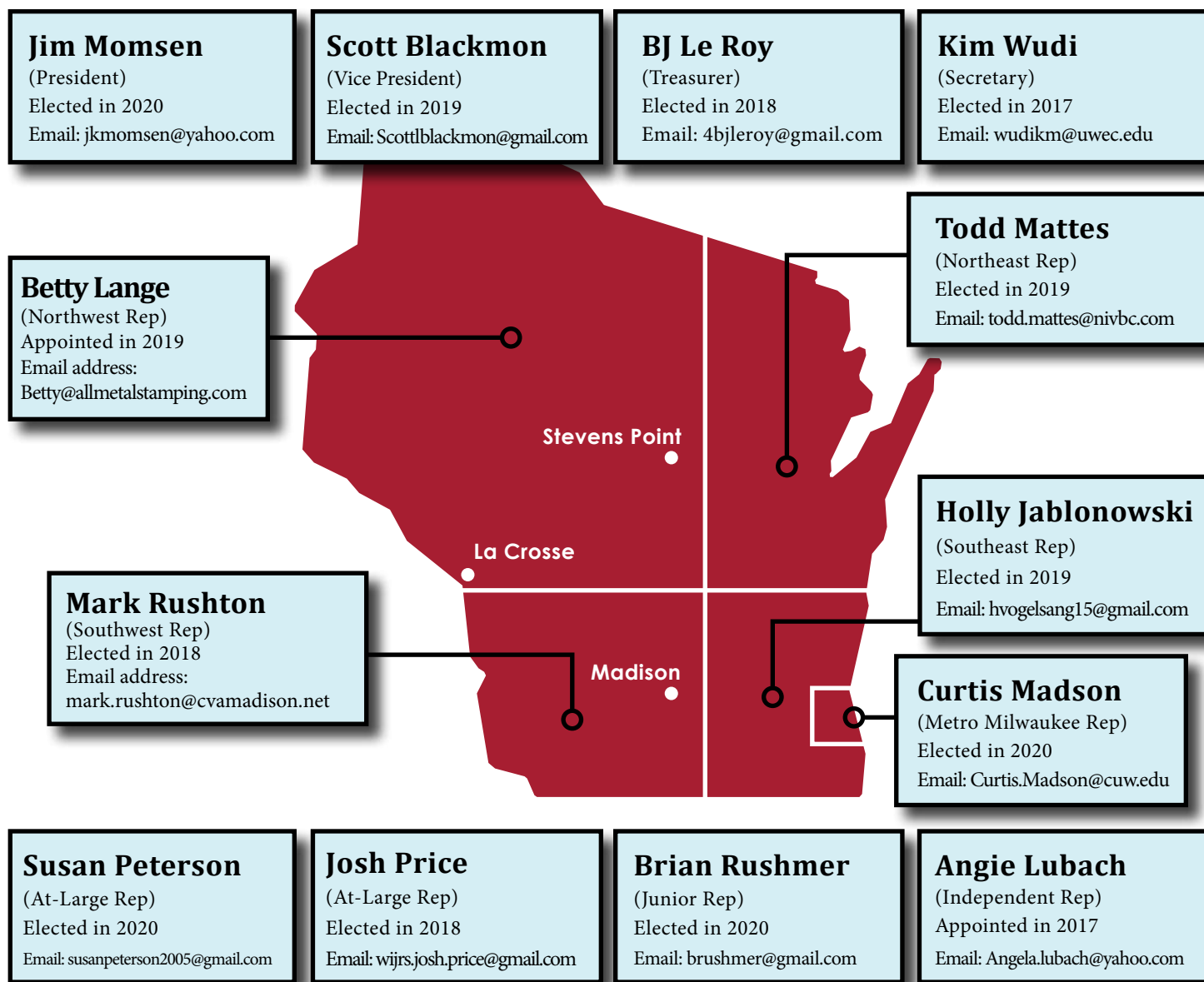
representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the

game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

USAV adjusts age-definition calendar for 2020-21

The USA Volleyball board of directors voted July 1, 2020, to adjust the USAV junior age definitions; effective for the 2020-21 season. This change is in accordance with motions for change passed by both the Regional Volleyball Association Assembly as well as the USA Volleyball Junior Assembly.

The junior age definition for each age group was adjusted to a start date of July 1st (the date had previously been September 1st).

Questions you should ask your club and yourself

You've figured out what age division you need to play in. You've identified a few clubs in your area. Now for the hard part: picking just ONE club to play for during the upcoming season.

This is a big decision. Club volleyball requires an investment of both time and money. It is a good idea to find out as much as you can about your different options before making any decisions. Remember to avoid assumptions as you start this process. Don't assume a big club is better than a small club. Don't assume a volunteer coach is better than a paid coach. Don't assume the right fit for your friend is the right fit for you. Talk to several different clubs as you start to gather information.

QUESTIONS TO ASK THE CLUB

- What is the club philosophy? To win? To improve? To have fun?
- How do you select your players?
- What age groups do you offer? How many teams do you have at each age level?
- What level do the teams compete at? Open, Club, Regional?
- Do you follow Badger Region Best Practices for tryouts?
- Who are the coaches at my age level? How many coaches?
- What is their background in coaching?
- How is playing time allocated? Can athletes "play up?"
- Are there opportunities for private training?
- What are your club dues? Is there a payment schedule?
- What is covered/not covered in that fee?
- Are there any other financial obligations? How is travel handled? Is there fund-raising opportunities? Do players keep uniforms?
- Will you allow the athlete to play the position he or she wants, or is that strictly a decision of the coaching staff?
- Where, when and how often do you practice?
- Are practices mandatory? What if my child misses a practice? Misses a tournament?
- Are players allowed to play other sports during the club season?
- Does the club offer any sort of strength, speed or conditioning programs? And are those sessions mandatory? Do they cost extra?
- How long is your season? Do you offer any beach opportunities?
- How far will the team be traveling?
- Is the club a non-profit organization? Is there a board of directors?

Once you have gathered this information for several clubs, take a minute to think about what you hope to get out of the experience.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF AND/OR YOUR CHILD

- What does my child want to get out of the club experience?
- Does my child want to play in high school? At what level in college?
- Does my child just want to enjoy the game and play with friends?
- What is my child's priority for allocating free time: job, activities with friends, other club sports, etc.?
- Can my child keep up with school work?
- Can we afford the program we choose?
- How important is it that we, as parents, travel with our child? Can we save money if our child travels with the team?

Sit down as a family and figure out which clubs match your player's goals, commitment level, financial situation, etc. Once you have picked several top choices, register with Badger Region/USAV and select the Fall Membership option. This enables you to participate in region programming (such as tryouts). Please note you will ALSO need to register for the tryout through each individual club as they are a separate organization.

Attend tryouts for several of your top choices if possible. One club may decide to offer you a roster spot while a different club may not. Trying out for several clubs gives you options and a "safety net" in case your top club does not offer you a spot.

TYPICAL BUDGET FOR PARENTS

- * Annual Club Fee (ask what sort of payment plans are offered)
- * Uniforms (sometimes included in annual fee)
- * Badger Region/USA Volleyball membership fee (\$50)
- * Travel: Lodging, hotels, airline tickets, food, etc.
- * Spirit wear: Non-required items such as hoodies, long-sleeve t-shirts, sweats, hats, etc.
- * Team-related gatherings: Food, t-shirts, hair ties, other keepsakes
- * Hidden costs associated with practice: Gasoline, tolls, car maintenance, shoes, sandals, spectator entry fees

COMMON CLUB VOLLEYBALL MYTHS

Myth 1 - It's about the club, not the coaches. The reputation of the club your son or daughter plays for is important, but it does not guarantee the coach your athlete will play for is skilled and/or right for you. Understand the philosophies, reputation, style and character of the coach your athlete will be playing for. Interview the coach if necessary. Speak with other players and parents who played for the coach in the past. Also ask yourself; is this person someone you want your son or daughter to spend time with? Is this a person of integrity and character?

Myth 2 - The more expensive the club fees the better the club/coaching and the more you get. After all, isn't the saying, "...you get what you pay for..." true? Not always. Some clubs charge more because they must cover their overhead (salaries for full time employees), turn a profit and/or pay more for gym rental. Other clubs charge more because they were formed by a sports complex as a way of filling gym time.

Myth 3 - Playing club for your high school coach ensures playing time on the high school team. Fact; the best players will play regardless of the club they play for. Sometimes playing club for your high school coach can be a negative. HS coaches sometimes "pigeon hole" or "slot" players into certain positions based on their biases or a need they are trying to fill for the high school team and not necessarily the best position for your child. It is sometimes a good idea to get a fresh look from a different coach.

Myth 4 - Playing in tournaments across the country provides more exposure to college coaches. While it is true many college coaches attend national tournaments, a LARGE majority of the players from this area who go on to play volleyball, play within a three hour driving radius of their homes. So how does playing in a tournament in on the East or West Coast provide exposure to college coaches locally? Plus, colleges have lots of new rules during the pandemic where they CAN'T travel. So play for enjoyment, not for scholarship.



2020-21 MEMBERSHIP + REFUNDS

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JUNIOR MEMBERSHIPS

FULL JUNIOR MEMBERSHIP (\$50) Sept. 1, 2020-Aug. 31, 2021

For boys and girls junior players. This is a full-year membership that is required for regional and national competition. Membership benefits also include USAV secondary insurance coverage, training resources and access to Regional and National High Performance programs.

2020 FALL MEMBERSHIP (\$15) Sept. 1, 2020-Dec. 1, 2020

This is a limited membership that is good from the time of purchase through Nov. 30. This is an ideal option for those who have never played club volleyball before or are unsure if they will participate for the entire season. This membership should be used for tryouts or for any players training in fall due to not having a high school team. Players **MUST** upgrade to participate in practices and tournaments with a club team once they receive an offer from a club. The cost to upgrade to a full junior membership is \$35.

UPGRADE MEMBERSHIP (\$35) Oct. 2020-Aug. 31, 2021

Available to players who have already purchased a one-event or tryout membership and will participate for the entire club season in regional or national competition.

YOUTH MEMBERSHIP (\$15) Sept. 1, 2020-Aug. 31, 2021

For boys and girls players ages 9-11 for recreational play only. Includes USAV insurance. If a player will participate on a junior roster, there is an upgrade available to a full junior membership for \$35.

YOUTH MEMBERSHIP (FREE) Sept. 1, 2020-Aug. 31, 2021

For boys and girls players up to age 8 for recreational play only. If a player will participate on a junior roster, there is an upgrade available to a full junior membership for \$50.

*** NOTE:** The Badger Region is requiring all members to pay any applicable credit card fees associated with the purchase of their Badger Region/USA Volleyball memberships. This is for both Junior and Adult memberships.

ADULT MEMBERSHIPS

FULL ADULT MEMBERSHIP (\$50) Sept. 1, 2020-Aug. 31, 2021

This is a full-year membership for all officials, players and those associated with a junior club (directors, coaches, tournament directors, board members). An additional background screening fee will be required if you will have contact with juniors and do not have an updated screen in the system (screen is good for two seasons). Membership benefits also include USAV insurance coverage and access to all Regional and National tournaments and events.

COLLEGIATE MEMBERSHIP (\$27) Sept. 1, 2020-Nov. 30, 2020

Full-year membership for college-age members **ONLY** who will be playing, officiating or coaching. Proof of enrollment in college can be requested at any time or membership will be suspended. Those members associated with juniors (coaches or officials) must also complete a background screen if there is not a current screen in the system.

ONE-EVENT MEMBERSHIP (\$10) (One event, one date only)

For all adults 18 and over for **PLAYING** in one event. This membership is not valid for anything regarding junior volleyball (i.e. coaching or officiating). This is a membership option that is limited to one event only (i.e. a two-day tournament) and includes USAV insurance coverage. Players who will participate in more than one event must purchase multiple one-event memberships if they choose not to become a full member. Not valid for USAV Adult Open National Championships.

UPGRADE MEMBERSHIP (\$40) (Oct. 2020-Aug. 31, 2021)

Available to players who have already purchased a one-event membership and will participate for the rest of the season, including USAV Adult Nationals.

CHAPERONE MEMBERSHIP (\$27) (Sept. 1, 2020-Aug. 31, 2021)

For team chaperones and Serve United participants only, not for coaching or any other role. Minimum age is 25 and member benefits include all of those listed under a full adult membership. A background screen must also be completed for an added fee.

REFUNDS

As a rule, the Badger Region will not refund membership purchases. It is highly advised to purchase a tryout/fall membership and upgrade upon receiving an invitation from a club to join their organization. Special cases of hardship and/or injury prior to using a full membership will be examined on a case-by-case basis. Any request for a refund must be received within 45 days of purchase, even in cases of duplicate purchases by mistake. If a refund is approved, credit card and administrative fees will be applied.

Any refund of a membership that has been used for a clinic, tryout, league, practice, tournament or High Performance tryout will not be refunded in full (and none of the USA Volleyball portion) as that must remain in place for future instances of insurance and membership claims. The region will handle any refund requests to USAV, if applicable.

FEE DISTRIBUTION

\$30 of the \$50 full membership stays with the Badger Region to help pay for coaching education, officials training, supplies, and clinics. Region management/administration (staff, office, supplies, meetings) and promotion and advancement of the sport in the state of Wisconsin is also part of the initiatives paid for through the full membership.

\$20 of the \$50 full membership goes to the USA Volleyball national office to help pay for sport accident insurance and liability insurance, coaching and officials education, training and development of support materials provided to the Region as well as sport development and promotion, the member management system and national office management. A credit card fee will also be added to each membership for an additional cost.

E.S.P. SPORTSMANSHIP PROGRAM

You may see wristbands around our region with the ESP (Enthusiastic. Supportive. Positive) message. We have one for you, if you can live by these three words as you cheer for teams, coaches and officials in our region. These wristbands are for fans, not players who show what it means to be a great spectator and even better model for sportsmanship in the stands. Recipients of these wristbands receive prizes at the Badger Region Championship.

SERVE UNITED PARENT PROGRAM

As part of the Serve United program, parents register using a discounted membership. Then they get certified as a scorer and also learn about line judging, libero tracking and being a second referee via the free online tutorials available through the USA Volleyball Academy. These adults can then contribute to the success of the club and ease some stress on the team if they're able to step in and give a player a break to eat, rehydrate or rest.

YOUTH PLAYER CLINICS

Each year, the Badger Region runs approximately four girls youth clinics in the fall and four boys youth clinics in the winter/spring. These are for middle school-age athletes and are free for all members. On top of that, the Region runs three free beach clinics each summer. In addition, the Region operates the Badger Boys Series (BBS), a local developmental league for middle school boys.

FIND A PLAYER/FIND A TEAM

Each fall, the Badger Region works to find homes for all members looking for a club to play for. And we help clubs find athletes to fill holes on their rosters. This service is free for all members and all member clubs.

5 REASONS TO BE A REF

THE PAY

First-year officials make \$27 for a best-out-of-three match, which most tournaments use in pool play and playoffs. After your first year, you can earn \$30 per match (or more). Most matches take about one hour to complete, so you are making about \$30 per hour. At a majority of events, officials work eight matches a day. In the Badger Region, first-year officials have the costs associated with becoming an official (membership, background screening and \$25 admin fee) reimbursed if they officiate at a minimum of four tournaments.

THE SCHEDULING

Want to work every weekend throughout the club season? There are opportunities to do so. Referees (both scorers and referees) are needed at juniors tournaments through the state of Wisconsin every week. And if you are available, you can make yourself available in the scheduling program. Only available to work half the day? You can set that up, too. It's that easy. After all, you are an independent contractor. You determine your schedule.

THE GAME

Want to talk about being right there in the action? You've got one of the best seats in the house. And you're there to make sure the game is played fair and by rules. And, let's be honest, the game is awesome. It's played by athletes of many different ability levels. It's played by folks of ALL ages. It's played around the world almost more than any other sport. Being an official is an integral part of the game and helps to make it a better experience. If you're a first-year official, your assignments will be in line with your experience level. But as you gain in ability and experience, you'll be officiating some high-level matches. How cool is that?

THE PEOPLE

Getting to know the athletes, coaches and officials who make up the Badger Region make the officiating experience even more valuable. The volleyball community has some amazing people in it. In the Badger Region, there are people (coaches and officials) who played in the Olympics. There are officials who have traveled internationally to ref volleyball matches around the world. There are athletes who have stories that you would not even imagine. Getting to know the people is something you will enjoy more than you will know.

THE OPPORTUNITY TO GIVE BACK

Whether you're a sports parent or a current or former athlete, you probably have memories about the club volleyball scene that you loved and will cherish for years to come. Now, imagine that you can help another parent or player enjoy similar memories that you have had the opportunity to create on the court or in the stands. As an official, you will help continue to grow the game and give back to the sport that gave you so much! Consider it an awesome way to challenge yourself!



USAVolleyball

All Badger Region referees undergo a standardized training program consisting of two stages: Knowledge transfer (classroom, plus E-learning) and practical application (on-court evaluation).

After completing their initial training stages, including registering or renewing your USAV membership and having a current background screen, a referee is eligible to accept paid match assignments, but may continue their training by working through four certification levels: Provisional, Regional, Junior National and National.

Each referee-certification level builds upon the previous level and pushes the referee to increase their skills. Completing a certification level allows a referee to officiate increasingly difficult matches.

All Badger Region officials must be 16-years-of-age or older, members of USA Volleyball through the Region and, if officiating juniors, successfully pass a background screen administered during the registration process. Failure to do so will prohibit you working junior tournaments. All Badger Region officials must also agree to abide by the Badger Region Code of Conduct for Officials.

Sept. 7: Tryouts/season begin for all WIAA high school athletes (boys and girls)

Oct. 3: Tryouts allowed for all boys and girls 14-and-under in the Badger Region.

Nov. 5-7: WIAA State Volleyball Championships (boys and girls) in Green Bay.

Nov. 14: Tryouts allowed for all boys and girls 15-and-older in the Badger Region.

Jan. 9-10: First weekend of Badger Region Power League

Feb. 20-21: Second weekend of Badger Region Power League

March 13-14: First weekend of Badger Region Championships. Ages are set to include Girls 11, Girls 12s, Girls 13s and Girls 15s. Age levels are subject to change.

March 27-28: Second weekend of Badger Region Championships. Ages are set to include all boys divisions, Girls 16s, Girls 17 and Girls 18s. Age levels are subject to change.

April 10-11: Third weekend of Badger Region Championships for Girls 14s, and Dale Rohde Memorial Boys Volleyball Tournament. Age levels are subject to change.

April 17-18: Third weekend of Badger Region Power League

All dates are subject to change based on the latest COVID-19 updates and any CDC or government regulations that have been adjusted.

What makes your club unique in your market?

We are small-town proud. We provide a niche in our rural area for girls that would otherwise not be able to play. We keep our costs low thanks to local, generous donors. We practice only once a week, on Sundays, to allow our local athletes the opportunity to play other sports and/or be involved in other activities. Small town athletics needs multi-sport athletes and we are flexible to allow this to happen. When we host tournaments our parents don't have to bake items and work long shifts, then get to be in the stands to watch them play! Our local Kiwanis club sets up the concessions stand. Bring a non-perishable food item to our tournament and get discounted admission. This past year we donated hundreds of pounds of food to the local food pantry to feed hungry families in our country (in the bottom five most needy countries in the State). We also started a scholarship fund.

What are your club's coaching philosophies or pillars of athlete development?

We count wins by player development not by medals around the neck. Being in a small, rural community offers us challenges to compete against bigger clubs/schools. We have less players, under-sized, and get less court time than our rivals. Players unable to make a bigger city club are often starters for us. But we compete until the whistle blows. It is unlikely any of our players will go on to play college volleyball, but all our players will take what they've learned and be better teammates on their high schools teams. They will be a more solid supporting cast for those with bigger ambitions.

What are you most proud of when telling others about your club?

We started our club four years ago with 19 girls in three ages groups. Our first 12U team has one 12U player, 2 11U and 3 10U players and had to play against bigger clubs with more experience and practice. We won one match that season. We didn't cut a single kid that tried out with us during our first three years. Four years later we have five age groups and 50 girls willing to play for us. We are still building, but won our first medals in 2020. We aren't the best, but we are family

Anything else you would like to add about your club?:

Play for REIGN VBC for two years and be eligible for our annual college scholarship. This year we presented two of our former athletes with \$350 scholarships. All our funds go back to the club and our ladies. We are a 501(c)(3) non-profit. It is all about the kids.
