Bryant & Stratton College to add men's volleyball

WAUWATOSA, WI - Bryant & Stratton College - Wisconsin Athletics has received a \$10,000 grant from the NJCAA Foundation and First Point Volleyball Foundation to start an NJCAA men's volleyball program.

"We are very happy to receive this funding from the wonderful collaboration of the NICAA Foundation and First Point Volleyball Foundation," said Greg Brandner, Bryant & Stratton's Athletic Director. "This is a great opportunity for Bryant & Stratton to attract young men to compete in NJCAA volleyball while having the opportunity to receive an athletic scholarship while pursuing a degree. Wisconsin has a strong

collegiate men's club volleyball circuit and the boys high school and club programs continues to grow. We are very excited to get started and help grow the sport."

The Bobcats plan to start men's volleyball competition in Spring 2023 and will offer athletic scholarships to student-athletes. The grant will help support the launch of the program including a coach's salary, uniforms, and equipment.

"The ability to create more opportunities for student-athletes to compete in college and take part in a growing sport is one of the ultimate wins the NJCAA Foundation can achieve," said Brian Luckett, NJCAA Foundation Executive

Director. "We are appreciative of First Point Volleyball Foundation for making this possible and the NJCAA member colleges who have stepped up to make history by bringing back men's volleyball to the association."

Bryant & Stratton currently offers women's court volleyball and women's beach volleyball. The addition of men's volleyball will bring the Bobcats to 21 sports programs.

A nationwide men's volleyball head coaching search will begin in Fall 2021.

Region to compete in USA-All Star Championships

ORLANDO, FLA. — The Regions of USA Volleyball are proud to announce the creation of the USA All-Star Championships, an elite volleyball event for regional all-star teams, that will be held July 21-25 in Orlando, Fla. This event will replace the High Performance Championships, originally scheduled for Phoenix, Arizona.

Produced by the regions and hosted by the Florida Region of USA Volleyball at the Orange County Convention Center, the inaugural event will feature all-star teams from many of the 40 Regions of USA Volleyball in six women's/girl's divisions and three boy's divisions.

The Orange County Convention Center's Executive Director Mark Tester commented, "The OCCC is thrilled to welcome and support this USA Volleyball sanctioned all-star event along with its athletes, coaches and fans to our safe and healthy venue in Orlando. Volleyball continues to be a significant driver in Central Florida's economic recovery and we are pleased that Orlando was selected as the host city for the upcoming USA All-Star Championships in July!"

Since the unfortunate cancellation of the High Performance Championships on May 6, the Regions have worked to secure



convention center space and court rentals and have committees in place to finalize details on international and high-level officials and training opportunities, collegiate coaches and recruiting opportunities, vendors (AES, BallerTV, University Athlete, NeuroFuel, GymRats & Team Travel Source) and many

other partners, to ensure this event exceeds all expectations.

"This is an important annual event and the speed at which it was formed is a testament to the collective talent and creativity of the 40 regions of USA Volleyball," commented Steve Bishop, President of the Florida Region and this year's event host. "This group possesses amazing skills as independent organizations, and when those resources and talents are combined, there isn't much they cannot accomplish. On behalf of our Florida Region members, we're honored to host this inaugural event and we look forward to welcoming the regional all-star delegations and their fans along with top officials and college recruiters to Orlando later this summer for an event to remember."

With the changeover to a new membership season on the horizon, the recent changeover to Sports Engine, the unique circumstances that the COVID-19 pandemic presented and other storylines have families asking questions about "what membership does my athlete need if they participate in Fall League? The simple answer: It depends. This document known as our "Choose Your Own Adventure" will help guide you through the process of knowing what is needed for you, your son or your daughter for the Badger Region Youth Fall Volleyball League.



DID YOU HAVE A 2020-21 FULL OR SUMMER MEMBERSHIP?

(THIS MEMBERSHIP WOULD HAVE ALLOWED YOU TO PLAY 'TRAVEL/CLUB' VOLLEYBALL SEPT. 2020 -JULY 2021 OR PARTICIPATE IN CLINICS/BEACH EVENTS IN THE SUMMER OF 2021.



THEN ...

Your membership is good through Aug. 31, 2021. You do not need to buy an additional membership until your current one expires. You will still need to purchase a new membership for any activities that take place after Sept. 1. You may purchase a membership that will be activated on Sept. 1, 2021, and cover you through Aug. 31, 2021 on or after Aug. 1 of this year.

Note: There no longer is a Badger Region Fall Membership. This option was created by USA Volleyball in the wake of the uncertainty of the COVID-19 pandemic.



Summer membership: \$15. Covers athletes and coaches from the time of purchase through Aug. 31, 2021.

Full membership: \$50. Covers athletes and coaches Sept. 1, 2021, through Aug. 31, 2022. This membership also covers individuals for the 2021 BRYFVL, the 2021-22 club season and summer BRYFVL activities. You can purchase the 2021-22 full membership starting Aug. 1, 2021.



THEN ...

Assuming your program does tryouts or training in the months of May, June, July or August, you will need to purchase the Badger Region Summer Membership for \$15 to cover you for any practices that take place now through Aug. 31. You will still need to purchase an additional membership for any activities that take place after Sept. 1. You may purchase a membership that will be activated on Sept. 1, 2021, and cover you through Aug. 31, 2021 on or after Aug. 1 of this year.

Badger Region Board adjusts policies on 'retention'

The Badger Region Board of Directors met Monday, May 10, and modified the Retention Period that is currently being used.

The following language has been added to the current policy: If a club holds tryouts for non-residents, then that club's retention period could be the 7 days preceding the approved tryout date.

Only one retention period is allowed per club.

It is important to note the addition to the current Retention Policy is only if a club plans to offer an early tryout for out-ofregion athletes. All other clubs must still abide by the Aug. 1-10 Retention Period.

The fully updated Retention Offer policy states: Badger Region will allow an optional "Retention Period" Aug. 1-Aug. 10 for clubs to be able to offer a spot in their club for the previous season's players for the coming



season. After 7 p.m. CT on Aug. 10, this window closes until the applicable tryout period. However, if a club holds tryouts for non-residents, then that club's retention period could be the 7 days preceding the approved tryout date. Only one retention period is allowed per club.

Rationale: Regions throughout the country are moving their tryouts into summer. Allowing clubs to move their retention period up to get ahead of these border regions' tryout dates will allow Badger Region-based clubs the opportunity to retain their athletes from Wisconsin as well as have tryouts for out-of-state players in an effort to have a better understanding of the club/ team makeup at the same time as the neighboring Region.

Will this give a club an unfair advantage by allowing them to open Retention early? No. Since clubs only have access to athletes in their program who played for them last year, this is not going to be a concern.

It is not like an athlete from "Club Spikers" can get a Retention Offer from "Club Bumpers" any time of year (July or August). Under the new policy, a club may either use the "early retention period" or the standard Aug. 1-10 retention period. Not both.

The Board of Directors concluded that allowing this modification will help Wisconsin athletes have a better understanding of their options if they are considering trying out for a club that is outside of Wisconsin's borders.

If I were an athlete who was considering playing for an out-of-Region club that has tryouts July 18 (the new date set by the Great Lakes Region for the start of girls tryouts), I would like to know before July 18 if I was getting a retention offer from my club that I played with during the 2020-21 season. If I had to wait until Aug. 1, a potential spot at the out-of-Region club might have been snagged by another athlete, OR I may take an out-of-state offer to guarantee I had a place to play, not knowing if I was going to get a retention offer.



How is the Badger Region Board structured?


The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fouryear terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
