USA Volleyball Director of Officials Development Pati Rolf, a former Badger Region board member and longtime coach and referee in Wisconsin, was named as the first female 1st Referee leading the first all-female officiating crew for a Men's Olympic volleyball match in Olympic history in the match-up between Canada vs. Venezuela yesterday evening.

U.S. earns two golds in Tokyo

Congratulation to the U.S. Women's Indoor Team and the U.S. Women's Beach Team of April Ross and Alix Klineman for winning gold medals in their respective divisions at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

The gold medal by the women's indoor was the first gold medal the U.S. has won in the sport.

Here is how all six teams fared at the most recent summer Olympics

* Women's Indoor Team: Gold Medal by defeating Brazil. Jordan Larson named Most Valuable Player. Jordyn Poulter named Best Setter. Michelle Bartsch-Hackley was named top outside hitter. Haleigh Washington named one of



the top middle blockers. Justine Wong-Orantes named top libero.

* Men's Indoor: Finished 2-3 in pool play. All three loses occurred to teams who made the Final Four. One of its wins was over France, the eventual Gold Medal Winning Team.

* Women's Beach: Alix Klineman an April Ross won Gold without dropping a set in the playoffs.

* Women's Beach: Kelly Claes and Sarah Sponcil won their pool but lost in the first round of bracket play to Canada.

* Men's Beach: Jake Gibb and Tri Bourne placed second in their pool but lost in the Round of 16 to Germany.

* Men's Beach: Nick Lucena and Phil Dalhausser finished tied for first in their pool but lost to Qatar in the Round of 16.

Both Gibb and Dalhausser announced their retirements at the conclusion of the Olympics.

Individuals who are given the Meritorious Service Award are eligible for other awards from USA Volleyball, including the prestigious "Friar Award." The award is named after Robert L. Lindsay, the eighth president of USA Volleyball (1980-1984) and a former regional commissioner.

Jr. Vikings coach receives national AVCA honor

The American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) has announced its club awards for the 2021 season. The AVCA Club Awards program is in its sixth year and recognizes deserving coaches in the youth/ club volleyball community.

The AVCA Club Awards Committee selected a Club Coach of the Year in each of the seven girls age divisions (12-18), a Beach Club Coach of the Year, a Boys Club Coach of the Year, a Club Director of the Year and for the first time, a Beach Club Director of the Year. Club Award honorees will be recognized at the Jostens Coaches Honors event at the 2021 AVCA Convention in Columbus, Ohio.

How long have you been at your club? 3 years

Other places you have coached: None! I finished my volleyball career in 2016 and started with Junior Vikings in 2018!

What made you decide to get into coaching volleyball? I loved playing volleyball growing up, but did not get to start playing club until I was a sophomore in high school. After finishing out my career at Marquette University, I still wanted to be involved with the game and Junior Vikings gave me an opportunity to do that! I love seeing the progress of the girls while they are still so young and fostering their love of the game!

Which coach(es) have influenced you the most? I had amazing coaches in high school, club and at Marquette. I had 2 coaches at Marquette who really influences the way I played and now coach as well. Jackie Simpson taught me how to be a passionate player and coach and bring energy to every practice and game to get the team excited. Erich Hinterstocker showed me how important attention to detail is and taught me how to teach the individual skills. I use the same language that he used during practice with my players today!

What is your favorite practice drill or activity? My favorite drill is Columbia (...or Around the World as my team fondly renamed it). I love that the rules are slightly different than a real game and it forces the girls to communicate about where they are on the court.

What is your favorite part of your coaching job? My favorite part of coaching is the girls I coach. Their passion for the game this year was contagious and made every practice and tournament so enjoyable. They worked really hard and refused to lose.

What questions do you have about being an official?

The Badger Region has begun planning for its 2021-22 season and that means working with current and future officials who will ref matches throughout the state this year.

Training sessions are in the works, and we would love to see more new faces at all of our events this season.

But, we know you're strapped for time, we have some answers to frequently asked questions right here. Send your questions



that you might have for this column to brian@badgervolley-ball.org.

1. What is the time commitment or frequency of work? Is it every weekend, Saturday and Sunday, or more of a sign-up for the availability model?

Time commitment is as much as you want. After certifying as an official, Sara will work with you to establish a ZebraWeb account where you will mark your availability. If you can only work Sundays, then you block off every Monday-Saturday and she will only assign you to Sunday events

2. Is the frequency or time commitment different from an official to a scorer?

Scorers do not get as much opportunity to work as officials. Scorers are used on occasion at our larger, more prestigious events such as the Badger Region Qualifier or the Badger Region Championships. Some other events do request score monitors, where you can help oversee the score sheets that the youth athletes and coaches are working on during matches. That, too, is an option.

3. What is the geographic area covered for travel?

Sara generally tries to assign you to the geographic region in which you live. If she needs you in to go outside a specific geographic area, she will usually ask in advance and you can decline. Just make sure to keep an open line of communication with her.

4. Is there a deadline to complete the certification process for the upcoming 2021-2022 season?

There isn't necessarily a deadline to get things done. But the sooner you get them done, the sooner you can be assigned and get your on-court evaluation (if needed) complete. Some of our bigger and more prestigious events in the region fill up fast.

USAV Beach Tour gets new look, rides Olympic wave

With the goal of increasing participation in beach volleyball across the country, USA Volleyball and its 40 regions announces the launch of the rebranded USA Volleyball Beach Tour.

With an updated logo and streamlined look, the rebranded tour will build off the momentum generated by millions watching the U.S. Beach National Teams at the Tokyo Olympics.

"Beach volleyball has seen tremendous growth in the last five years," USA Volleyball President and CEO Jamie Davis said. "We're excited to usher in a new era with the introduction of the USA Volleyball Beach Tour brand and expand opportunities for young athletes to get involved in the sport."

The growth in beach volleyball has been shown in both the collegiate and junior ranks. More than 90 colleges across all divisions now offer the discipline, and over the last five years has been the fastest-growing NCAA Division I sport.

The USA Volleyball Beach Tour rebrands the USA Na-



tional Beach Tour, which was created in 2018. As of the end of the 2021 season the tour has grown to over 30 national qualifying events across the country. The USA Volleyball Beach Tour will operate under the same guidelines, with clubs and regions hosting beach national qualifiers and beach regional qualifiers across the country. Through the qualifier system, athletes earn the opportunity to compete at the USA Volleyball Beach National Championship, held every summer. At National Qualifiers, bids to the coveted

Open Division are awarded, while American Division bids are available for top finishers at Regional Qualifiers.

"This beach tour rebrand will help to strengthen its brand affiliation with USA Volleyball and the 40 regions of USAV," said Steve Bishop, Florida Region commissioner and Beach Development representative to the USAV Board of Directors. "In past years, we've seen continued growth in the beach space across the U.S. as more playing opportunities are being created annually for our members. We commend our USAV promoters that host the regional and national qualifiers in communities throughout the regions. Our collective goal and mandate is to have the highest athlete safeguards while creating the most competitive events in the U.S. I look forward to what the future holds for the USA Volleyball Beach Tour."

The event was last held in Orlando in 2016 with a record number of 578 teams in attendance. USA Volleyball also operates the Sunshine Classic Girls Junior National Qualifier annually in Orlando in early spring.

"USA Volleyball is thrilled to be bringing the USA Volleyball Open National Championship back to Orlando in 2022," said Jamie Davis, USA Volleyball president and CEO. "Visit Orlando, the Greater Orlando Sports Commission, and the Orange County Convention Center always prove to be wonderful hosts for our athletes, officials, coaches and fans. I am sure that

This document known as our "Choose Your Own Adventure" will help guide you through the process of knowing what is needed for you, your son or your daughter for the Badger Region Youth Fall Volleyball League.



DID YOU HAVE A 2020-21 FULL OR SUMMER MEMBERSHIP?

(THIS MEMBERSHIP WOULD HAVE ALLOWED YOU TO PLAY 'TRAVEL/CLUB' VOLLEYBALL SEPT. 2020 -JULY 2021 OR PARTICIPATE IN CLINICS/BEACH EVENTS IN THE SUMMER OF 2021.



THEN ...

Your membership is good through Aug. 31, 2021. You do not need to buy an additional membership until your current one expires. You will still need to purchase a new membership for any activities that take place after Sept. 1. You may purchase a membership that will be activated on Sept. 1, 2021, and cover you through Aug. 31, 2021 on or after Aug. 1 of this year.

Note: There no longer is a Badger Region Fall Membership. This option was created by USA Volleyball in the wake of the uncertainty of the COVID-19 pandemic.



COSTS

Summer membership: \$15. Covers athletes and coaches from the time of purchase through Aug. 31, 2021.

Full membership: \$50.

Covers athletes and coaches Sept. 1, 2021, through Aug. 31, 2022. This membership also covers individuals for the 2021 BRYFVL, the 2021-22 club season and summer BRYFVL activities. You can purchase the 2021-22 full membership starting Aug. 1, 2021.



You will still need to purchase an additional membership for any activities that take place after Sept. 1. How is the Badger Region Board structured?


The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fouryear terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:


