Pair of open houses coming Sept. 12, Sept. 26

Club directors are required to fill out a registration form if they are interested in having a table. Space is limited. Email brian@badgervolleyball.org for a copy of the form. The Badger Region is covering all costs for clubs to participate in this event.

The Boys Club Volleyball Open House is scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 3, at Pius XI High School in Wauwatosa.

All participating clubs must have a Club Registration/Info Sheet on file to be eligible to be present at this event. All coaches/directors on site must also have memberships and background screenings complete.

Phoenix to host G18s in April

USA Volleyball has selected Phoenix and the Phoenix Convention Center to host the 2022 USAV Girls 18s National Championship on April 22-24.

The Girls 18s event is in its sixth year as a stand-alone national championship with the inaugural event taking place in Milwaukee. The 2022 edition will include two new qualifying divisions that will increase the team count to more than 350 teams.

"We look forward to bringing the USAV Girls 18s National Championship to Phoenix for the first time," said USAV Events Director Kristy Cox. "Phoenix has been a great partner for us on past events and we know our athletes and their families will enjoy the city."

The Phoenix Convention Center has previously hosted the USAV Boys Junior National Championship and the USAV Open National Championship.

Qualifying events for the Girls 18s National Championship are expected to begin in January and run through March.

In 2021, 266 teams with approximately 3,300 athletes competed at Girls 18s in Columbus, Ohio.

Badger Region clubs who competed in 2021 included FC Elite, MKE Sting, Motion Volleyball Program, Midwest Penguins, One Wisconsin, Milwaukee Juniors, 414 Milwaukee Elite and Revolution Volleyball Academy.

- * March 26-27: Girls 11s, Girls 12s, Girls 13s and Girls 14s.



* April 2-3: Girls 15s, All Boys Divisions and Adults

This annual one-day tournament for boys will be March 19 or March 20 at the Wisconsin Center. It includes a tribute to longtime official, board member, player and parent Dale Rohde. The event includes a fundraiser silent auction.

The Badger Region Girls Qualifier will be Feb. 26-27 at the Milwaukee Sting Center. The Badger Boys Series for boys and other events have not been announced at this time.

2021-22 memberships available starting Sept. 1

Memberships from the 2020-21 club volleyball season in the Badger Region and USA Volleyball expire at 11:59 p.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 31, 2021.

At that time, all participants (athletes, coaches, officials and staff) will be required to purchase a membership for the 2021-22 season.

On Sept. 1, new memberships will be available to anyone looking to purchase a membership for the new year via Sports Engine.

Athletes participating in the Badger Region Youth Fall Volleyball League (BRYFVL) are required to have an active 2021-22 membership to compete and train with their middle school programs.

Memberships that will be available starting on Sept. 1 will include:

- * 2021-22 Badger Adult Coach of Juniors
- * 2021-22 Badger Adult with SafeSport and Background requirements (for chaperones/boards/admin/non-coaches)
- * 2021-22 Badger Collegiate-Aged Coach
- * 2021-22 Badger Junior-Aged Staff (SafeSport and IMPACT required — reminder that 18-year-olds can only be listed as assistant coaches. Anyone younger than 18 can only be listed as a manager)
- * 2021-22 Badger Junior 17 & Under Player



* 2021-22 Badger Junior 18s Player (SafeSport Required — for athletes who are 18 or will turn 18 during the 2021-22 season)

* 2021-22 Badger Region Tryout Membership (good for tryouts only — can be upgraded to a full membership after an athlete receives an offer from a club)

* 2021-22 Badger Region One-Event Membership (good for tune-up clinics, one-day camps, etc.)

* 2021-22 Badger One-Event Adult Player Membership

* 2021-22 Badger One-Event Adult Coach of Juniors Membership

* 2021-22 Badger Adult Player Membership

* 2021-22 Badger Collegiate Player Membership

* 2021-22 Badger Collegiate SafeSport & Background Screening Required

Region's Fall Youth Volleyball League begins Sept. 11

The Badger Region Youth Fall Volleyball League will mark year three of this growing middle school opportunity in Southeast Wisconsin starting Sept. 11.

Debuting in the Fall of 2019, BRYFVL is designed to offer competition and development for athletes new to volleyball at the middle school level.

The program is a high school feeder program and relies heav-

ily on the adult volunteers. This year features 207 teams across multiple divisions — both boys and girls.

"The growing impact that Fall League is having on high school teams all over the state is noticed by coaches, parents and athletes," said Program Specialist Sara Voigt. "We are looking forward to seeing the league in action this fall and hope to encourage more programs

to attend."

The league differs from club in that it depends on the leadership of the school and varsity coaches to make this happen. While schools can elect to make cuts and pick their teams as they choose, many schools do not make cuts.

This year, the Region will utilize the Milwaukee Sting Center and the New Berlin Sports Complex

for all weekends of BRYFVL play. Some weekends will also include competition at the RecPlex in Pleasant Prairie. The league runs through Oct. 31.

New programs for 2021 include the Wilmot Junior Panthers, Heritage Christian, and New Berlin United Boys.

For 2022, USA Volleyball has added the USA division to the 12s division as well as the Liberty division to ages 13-18 and the Freedom division to 14-18s.

The Liberty division will be a Qualifier-only division with 2 bids each if the threshold minimum numbers are met. The Freedom division – will be a Region-only division with 1-2 bids awarded depending on Region size (same as National division)

Maximum field size is listed to the right of each division.

USAV Beach Tour gets new look, rides Olympic wave

With the goal of increasing participation in beach volleyball across the country, USA Volleyball and its 40 regions announces the launch of the rebranded USA Volleyball Beach Tour.

With an updated logo and streamlined look, the rebranded tour will build off the momentum generated by millions watching the U.S. Beach National Teams at the Tokyo Olympics.

“Beach volleyball has seen tremendous growth in the last five years,” USA Volleyball President and CEO Jamie Davis said. “We’re excited to usher in a new era with the introduction of the USA Volleyball Beach Tour brand and expand opportunities for young athletes to get involved in the sport.”

The growth in beach volleyball has been shown in both the collegiate and junior ranks. More than 90 colleges across all divisions now offer the discipline, and over the last five years has been the fastest-growing NCAA Division I sport.

The USA Volleyball Beach Tour rebrands the USA National Beach Tour, which was created in 2018. As of the end of the 2021 season the tour has grown to over 30 national qualifying events across the coun-



try. The USA Volleyball Beach Tour will operate under the same guidelines, with clubs and regions hosting beach national qualifiers and beach regional qualifiers across the country. Through the qualifier system, athletes earn the opportunity to compete at the USA Volleyball Beach National Championship, held every summer. At National Qualifiers, bids to the coveted Open Division are awarded, while American Division bids are available for top finishers at Regional Qualifiers.

“This beach tour rebrand will help to strengthen its brand affiliation with USA Volleyball and the 40 regions of USAV,” said Steve Bishop, Florida Region commissioner and

Beach Development representative to the USAV Board of Directors. “In past years, we’ve seen continued growth in the beach space across the U.S. as more playing opportunities are being created annually for our members. We commend our USAV promoters that host the regional and national qualifiers in communities throughout the regions. Our collective goal and mandate is to have the highest athlete safeguards while creating the most competitive events in the U.S. I look forward to what the future holds for the USA Volleyball Beach Tour.”

The Badger Region receives numerous calls and emails from athletes, parents and clubs about what can be done to improve the tryout process. While the Region cannot mandate most of what is listed below, the Region's Board of Directors and the Region Staff recommend the following as best practices:

Before tryouts

- 1. Retention Period**
 - a. Communicate with the Badger Region office if your club plans to utilize the Retention Period via the pre-tryout survey that will be sent out.
 - b. Make offers Aug. 1-10, 2021, to athletes who played for your club during the 2020-21 club season. Make sure all paperwork is signed and filed and held by the club director until needed at a later time. (<http://badgervolleyball.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/07/Retention-Document-for-Clubs-2019-20.pdf>)
 - c. Publicize on your website, social media, tryout flyers, etc., whether your club made Region Period offers
 - d. Publicize on your website, social media, tryout flyers, etc., if only limited spots are available in your club for the 2020-21 club season



- 2. Communication**
 - a. Communicate with nearby clubs, or clubs who draw from the same pool of athletes, on dates/times to host tryouts. This will prevent athletes and families from having to pick one or the other when it comes to the first tryouts.
 - b. Communicate your 2020-21 tryout times, dates and location to current/former families and the general public. (You can't do this enough.)
 - c. Communicate open houses, tune-up clinics or other pre-season club events to current/former families and the general public.
 - d. Communicate upcoming deadlines (pre-registration deadlines, commitment deadlines, other club-specific deadlines such as when a determination will be made if a team is going to "fold" or when first payments and contracts are due).

- 3. Other**
 - a. Examine the Badger Region's "delinquent payment" list maintained at the Region office.
 - b. Be realistic. Seriously look at how many teams you can field (based on number of coaches available, gym time available, athletes in your area, other clubs in your area).
 - c. As you consider the number of teams you can field, have a tentative plan for how many teams you expect to offer at each age division as well as your club philosophy on moving players to older age groups and your club's subsequent ability to field teams at younger age levels.
 - d. The Region recommends a pre-registration process to make sure all payment, paperwork, payments and membership card numbers are filed before arriving on site.
 - e. Review all other Badger Region policies, procedures and dates as it pertains to tryouts.

During tryouts

- 1. Paperwork**
 - a. Make sure all players have a membership, medical release form and concussion form
 - b. Ask all athletes if they have accepted a Retention Offer to another club. If they have and show a club listed in their membership account, you might want to ask that athlete to kindly not participate in the tryout.
 - c. Do birth date checks on all athletes. Make sure that each athlete is trying out for the proper age level. Remember: Not all age waivers are granted. And under certain circumstances (teams who participate in Qualifiers/Nationals/Out-of-Region events), no age waivers are allowed.
 - d. Collect other payment and club-specific paperwork. State if tryout fees can be refunded.



- 2. While on the court**
 - a. Coaches and directors should go into tryouts with an open mind.

- b. Give each athlete who walks through the door a fair shot. And put them in positions that will give them the best chance to succeed (i.e. Put the 4-foot-6 athlete in more passing drills than blocking drills).
- c. Come with a plan. Hitting lines or kings/queens of the court for two hours is not a good plan.
- d. Have a group of coaches running the drills/tryout plan and a different group of coaches evaluating. The two groups should chat on a regular basis throughout the tryout.
- e. Be discrete when talking with other evaluators and/or coaches about the athletes, and/or have a place where you can discuss that is not within earshot of participants.
- f. Take lots of notes. Rate them according to a scale that all directors and coaches in your club can use and understand. Athletes (and parents) want feedback as to why they didn't make a team.



- 3. Making offers and beyond**
 - a. Communicate with all athletes whether they are getting an offer, if they are in line to get an offer, or if they are not getting an offer.
 - b. Remind athletes about the Badger Region Commitment Deadline (7 p.m. Monday after the start of the tryout period)
 - c. Explain your club's trickle-down process
 - d. Remind athletes how to make a commitment to a club in the member management system that will be discussed more at a later time.
 - e. Remind all athletes that if they pick a different club, it is OK. Tell them to let your club know right away so athletes in line for an offer will be able to get a spot sooner rather than later.

After tryouts

- 1. Filling teams**
 - a. Have a deadline of when your club will determine if a team will fold or come to fruition
 - b. Have a plan in place if you get lots of athletes at one gender/age level and not a lot at another.
 - c. Utilize the Badger Region website page dedicated to players looks for teams.
 - d. Advertise on the Badger Region site if you have a team looking for players
 - e. Contact nearby clubs to see if they have similar situation, and work together to combine those two small groups of athletes into one team at one of the clubs.
 - f. Announce on your website/social media when a team is filled and that no more offers will be going out for that specific team
 - g. Alert athletes on the "waiting list" for that team that no more offers will be made

- 2. Finalizing your roster**
 - a. Make sure your "committed" athletes have selected your club in the member management system. It is not official until this is done.
 - b. Make sure (again) that they meet the age requirements for this age group.
 - c. Make sure all paperwork is in for this athlete



- 3. Looking ahead**
 - a. Take notes on what worked and what did not.
 - b. Offer refunds where applicable in a timely manner.
 - c. Update online listing where applicable.
 - d. Shred any paperwork from athletes not needed for the upcoming season

Tryout details released for 2021-22 season

Region shares 'Best Practices,' 'Retention Period' details with club directors, families

As we are now officially in summer, we wanted to share some updated information in regards to tryouts for the 2021-22 club season. We will highlight a few changes (from USAV), identify first allowable dates for retention offers and tryouts, and share some "best practices" for you to consider when planning.

*** Retention Offers** — The Badger Region is once again offered a retention period of 10 days from Aug. 1 - Aug. 10. The use of retention offers was optional and at the discretion of each individual club. If issuing retention offers, the use of the retention period agreement form is required.

*** 2021-22 Tryout/Commitment Dates: — 14-and-under boys and girls (born July 1, 2007, and after)**

* First available date clubs can hold try-

outs: Oct. 2, 2021

* A player (regardless of whether they played for a club in the 2020-21 season) will not be required to commit to a club until 7 p.m. on Monday, Oct. 4.

* All offers made after 7:01 p.m. Oct. 4 are at the discretion of the club

— **15-and-older boys and girls (born June 30, 2007 and before)**

* First available date for tryouts: Nov. 13, 2021

* A player (regardless of whether they played for a club in the 2020-21 season) will not be required to commit to a club until 7 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 15.

* All offers made after 7:01 p.m. Nov. 15 are at the discretion of the club

*** Best Practices for Tryouts** - The Badger Region has compiled a list of Best Practices to be utilized before, during, and after tryouts. These will also be shared on our website, in our newsletter, and on social media.

We have asked club directors, coaches,

athletes and families to familiarize themselves with these Best Practices. The Best Practices were created by the Region's tryout committee consisting of region coaches, club directors, board members, and region staff.

Clubs will invite athletes to join their clubs via Sports Engine, just like they did for the 2020 season.

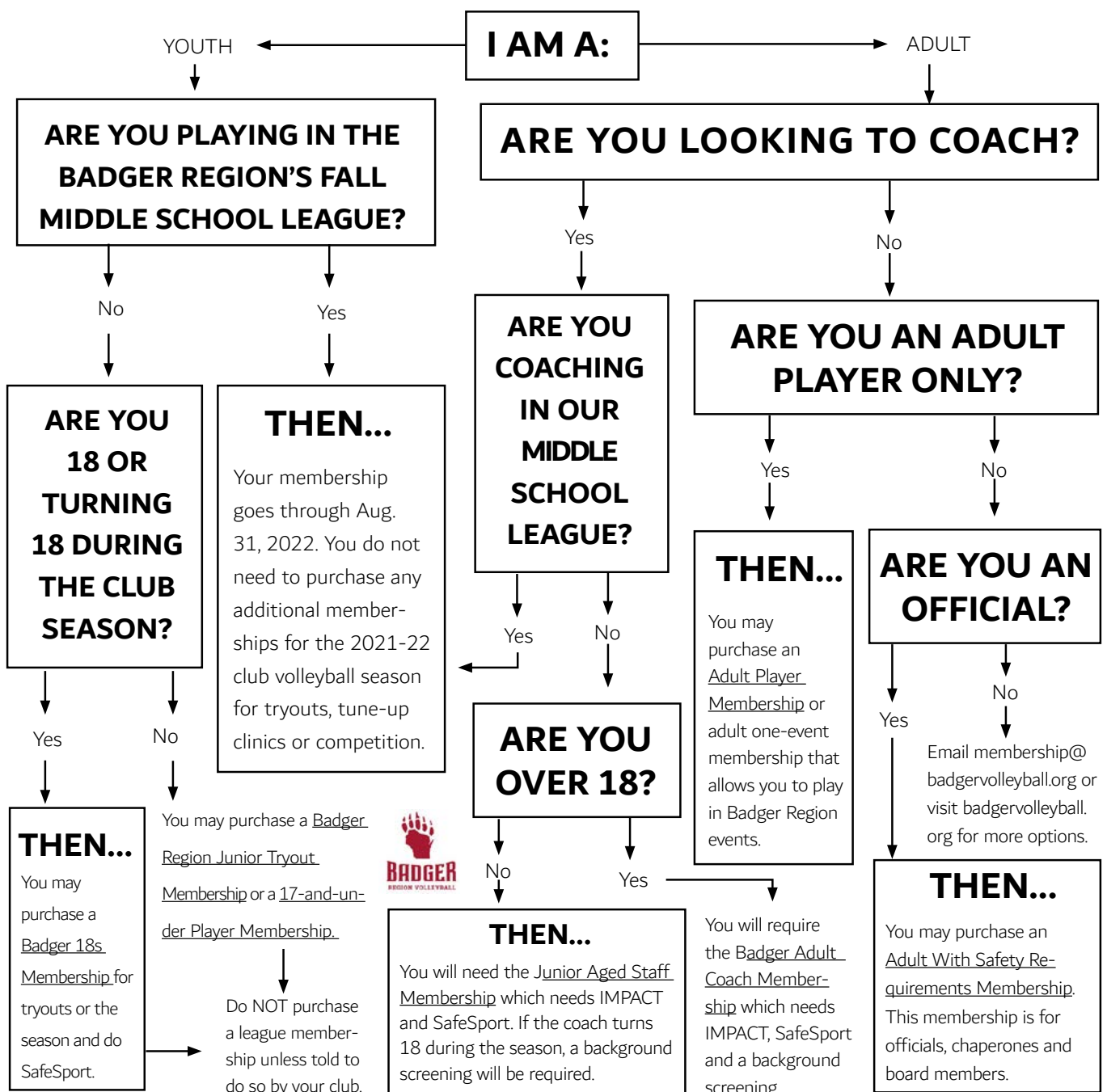
Parents and athletes should make sure that they have given their potential clubs the accurate email address and athlete information that corresponds to what is registered in Sports Engine.

All policies, dates, and supporting information will be posted to our website. The Badger Region recognizes that with the time missed this season and the unknown of what fall will bring, there may be some concerns and challenges related to tryouts.

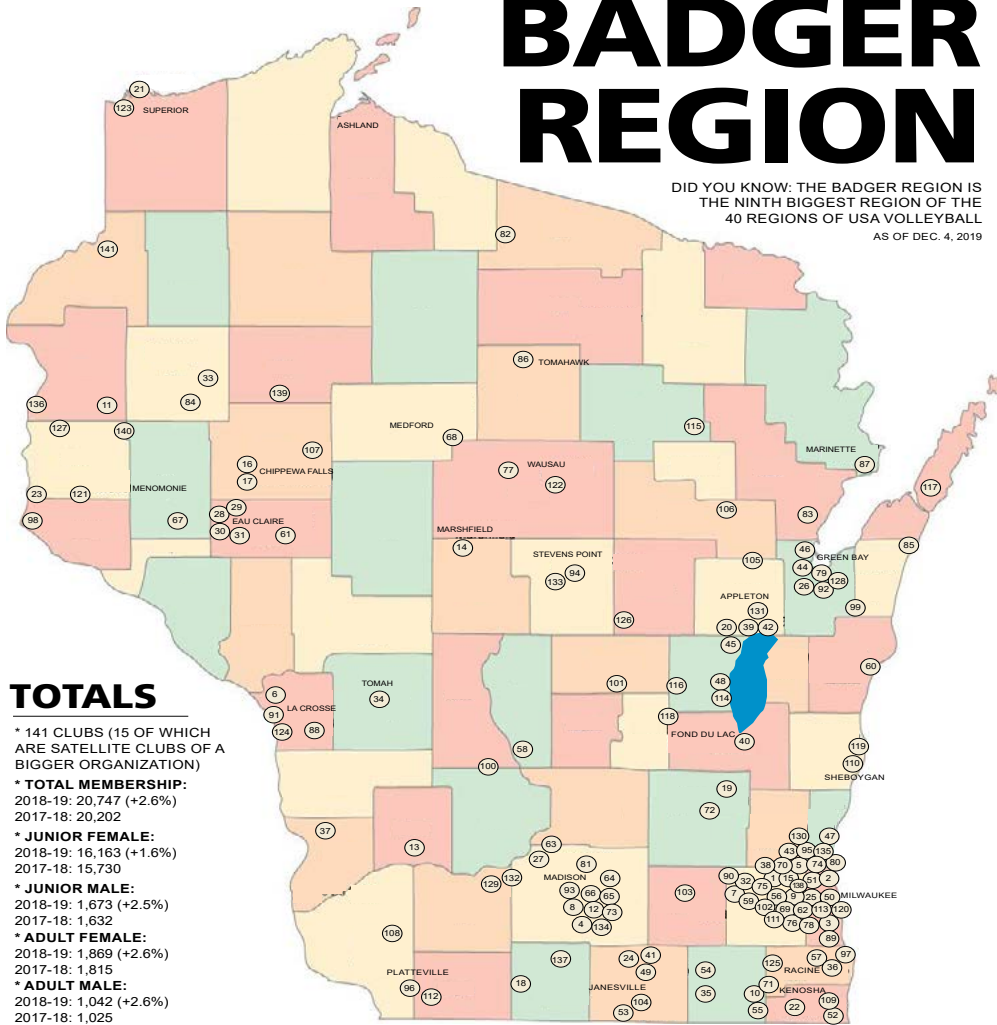

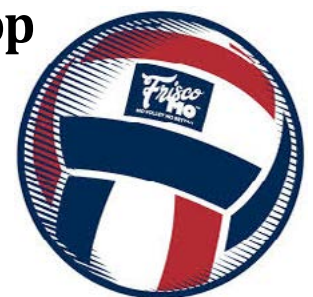

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

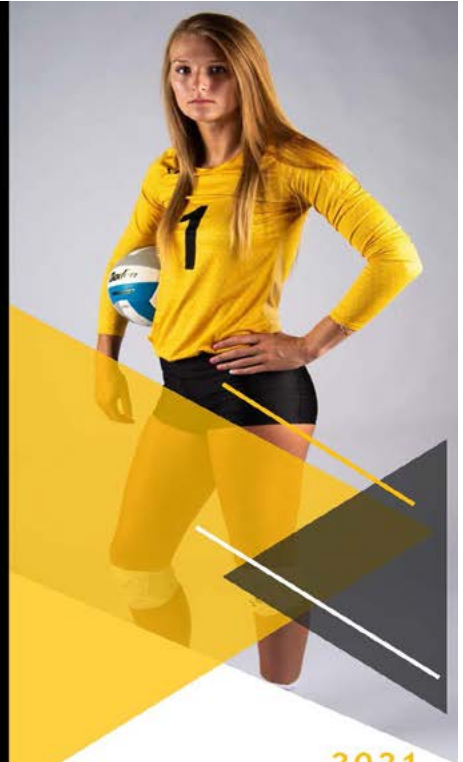
