2021-22 memberships now available

As of Sept. 1, new memberships for the 2021-22 season have been available to anyone looking to purchase a membership for the new year via Sports Engine.

Athletes participating in the Badger Region Youth Fall Volleyball League (BRYFVL) are required to have an active 2021-22 membership to compete and train with their middle school programs.

* 2021-22 Badger Junior 18s Player (SafeSport Required — for athletes who are 18 or will turn 18 during the 2021-22 season)

* 2021-22 Badger Region Tryout Membership (good for tryouts only — can be upgraded to a full membership after an athlete receives an offer from a club)

* 2021-22 Badger Region One-Event Membership (good for tuneup clinics, one-day camps, etc.) * 2021-22 Badger One-Event Adult Player Membership

* 2021-22 Badger One-Event Adult Coach of Juniors Membership

* 2021-22 Badger Adult Player Membership

Just take a look at these many opportunities coming up in the near future now that Labor Day is behind us:

It's the start of the high school season for boys and girls. It's go-time for the women's college season for NAIA and NCAA teams. It's the launch of our annual Badger Region Youth Fall Volleyball League.

For those keeping track at home, it's also the start of our eighth volume of the Badger Beacon that starts today.

On top of that, fall marks that time of year when the Badger Region hosts open houses where potential athletes can meet with clubs and their staff. (Check out the story on Page 1 of the today's Beacon.)

Next Sunday (Sept. 19), the Badger Region Board of Directors will also meet to lay out plans, budgets and policies for the 2021-22 season at its quarterly meeting.

In the meantime, we are also planning youth clinics for young and inexperienced players. Our first will take place the evening of Oct. 6 at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh. The next will be Saturday, Oct. 9, at St. Norbert College in DePere.

And before you know it, we'll be gathering at our first tryouts of the year (Oct. 2 for 14-and-under athletes, Nov. 13 for 15-and-older athletes).

So while summer may be over, there's a whole lot of excitement ahead in the Badger Region this fall.

3 open houses on the horizon

Three open houses are planned for parents and athletes to meet staff and learn about offerings of Badger Region clubs.

The three events are as follows:

* 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 12, at the Milwaukee Sting Center

* 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 26, at the New Berlin SportsPlex

* 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 3, at Pius XI High School (boys only)

The events are free for families to attend. On site, there will be anywhere between 12-16 clubs showcasing their offerings for the 2021-22 club volleyball season. In addition, the Badger Region staff will be on site to answer questions about our events, memberships and the upcoming 2021-22 season.

Families are encouraged to use this opportunity to learn about tune-up clinics, the tryout process and the commitment timeline as well as if a club used "retention" during the off season.

The event is paid for thanks to Badger Region Volleyball Association.

Club Directors/Staff should note that registration for the Sep. 12 event is now full. Registration for club directors for the Sept. 26 event can be found here. Nov. 3 registration coming soon.

Region's Fall Youth League begins Sept. 11

The Badger Region Youth Fall Volleyball League will mark year three of this growing middle school opportunity in Southeast Wisconsin starting Sept. 11.

Debuting in the Fall of 2019, BRYFVL is designed to offer competition and development for athletes new to volleyball at the middle school level.

The program is a high school feeder program and relies heavily on the adult volunteers. This year features 207 teams across multiple divisions both boys and girls.

"The growing impact that Fall League is having on high school teams all over the state is noticed by coaches, parents and athletes," said Program Specialist Sara Voigt. "We are looking forward to seeing the league in action this fall and hope to encourage more



programs to attend."

The league differs from club in that it depends on the leadership of the school and varsity coaches to make this happen. While schools can elect to make cuts and pick their teams as they choose, many schools do not make cuts.

This year, the Region will utilize the Milwaukee Sting Center and the New Berlin Sports Complex for all weekends of BRY-FVL play. Some weekends will also include competition at the RecPlex in Pleasant Prairie. The league runs through Oct. 31.

New programs for 2021 include the Wilmot Junior Panthers, Heritage Christian, and New Berlin United Boys.

Phoenix to host G18s in April

USA Volleyball has selected Phoenix and the Phoenix Convention Center to host the 2022 USAV Girls 18s National Championship on April 22-24.

The Girls 18s event is in its sixth year as a stand-alone national championship with the inaugural event taking place in Milwaukee. The 2022 edition will include two new qualifying divisions that will increase the team count to more than 350 teams.

"We look forward to bringing the USAV Girls 18s National Championship to Phoenix for the first time," said USAV Events Director Kristy Cox. "Phoenix has been a great partner for us on past events and we know our athletes and their families will enjoy the city."

The Phoenix Convention Center has previously hosted the USAV Boys Junior National Championship and the USAV Open National Championship.

Qualifying events for the Girls 18s National Championship are expected to begin in January and run through March.

In 2021, 266 teams with approximately 3,300 athletes

competed at Girls 18s in Columbus, Ohio.

Badger Region clubs who competed in 2021 included FC Elite, MKE Sting, Motion Volleyball Program, Midwest Penguins, One Wisconsin, Milwaukee Juniors, 414 Milwaukee Elite and Revolution Volleyball Academy.

Indy also hosting

The 42nd annual edition of the

GJNC, for players ages 11-17, will be a 12-day event held at the Indianapolis Convention Center.

"USA Volleyball is excited to bring the Girls Junior National Championship back to Indianapolis in 2022," said USAV Events Director Kristy Cox. "Indy has proven to be a great host and partner for this event."

The bump to 12 days (currently the event takes 10 days) will allow

for more space in the convention center as the number of teams competing grows. USAV is expecting more than 1,600 teams in Indy with next year's growth and the introduction of two new divisions.

Indianapolis previously hosted the GJNC in 2016 and 2019.

The GJNC economic impact on the host city can be significant. The 2021 GJNC is being held in Las Vegas this week with more than 1,300 team registered. That means more than 15,000 players and an estimated 60,000 spectators visiting the city for volleyball over 10 days.

Boys headed to Las Vegas

The Boys Junior National Championships will be held in Las Vegas in late June/early July in 2022. No formal announcement is available yet as USA Volleyball is still working on exact dates and signing contracts with the hotels and facilities.

When more information is available regarding the BJNCs, the Badger Region will update its website as well as share new on social media.

Adult Nationals heading to Orlando in 2022

USA Volleyball has selected Orlando, Fla., to host the 2022 USA Volleyball Open National Championship, May 27-June 1, 2022.

The event was last held in Orlando in 2016 with a record number of 578 teams in attendance. USA Volleyball also operates the Sunshine Classic Girls Junior National Qualifier annually in Orlando in early spring.


"USA Volleyball is thrilled to be bringing the USA Volleyball Open National Championship back to Orlando in 2022," said Jamie Davis, USA Volleyball president and CEO. "Visit Orlando, the Greater Orlando Sports Commission, and the Orange County Convention Center always prove to be wonderful hosts for our athletes, officials, coaches and fans. I am sure that in addition to experiencing the best volleyball has to offer in the United States that our group will thoroughly enjoy their stay in the destination."

USA Volleyball will hold its annual meetings in Orlando ahead of the event and celebrate annual inductees and award honorees at the USA Volleyball Hall of Fame presented at the Dorothy C. Boyce Banquet on May 25.

"We look forward to welcoming the 2022 USA Volleyball Open National Championship and corporate annual meetings to Orlando in May of next year," said Casandra Matej, president and CEO of Visit Orlando. "Orlando has been successfully and safely hosting in-person group events since reopening over a year ago. From professional sports to youth tournaments, sports tourism has been an important force in our destination's recovery, and we are thrilled that USA Volleyball has selected Orlando for their event next year."

"We are so pleased to welcome our good friends at USA Volleyball back to Orlando for the 2022 Open National Championship, banquet and corporate meetings in May of 2022. Our community has a long history of hosting premier volleyball events, and we know that our guests and their families will have a tremendous experience while visiting us in Central Florida," said Jason Siegel, president and CEO of the Greater Orlando Sports Commission.

The Orange County Convention Center (OCCC) has hosted more than 100 face-to-face events since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic – July 2020. Most recently, sporting events have dominated the center's spring and summer calendar, welcoming various youth volleyball, basketball and wrestling tournaments to the region with athletes, coaches and spectators from around the world gathering safely at the venue.

Tryout details released for 2021-22 season

Region shares 'Best Practices.' 'Retention Period' details with club directors, families

As we are now officially in summer, we wanted to share some updated information in regards to tryouts for the 2021-22 club season. We will highlight a few changes (from USAV), identify first allowable dates for retention offers and tryouts, and share some "best practices" for you to consider when planning.

* Retention Offers — The Badger Region once again offered a retention period of 10 days from Aug. 1 - Aug. 10. The use of retention offers was optional and at the discretion of each individual club. If issuing retention offers, the use of the retention period agreement form is required.

* 2021-22 Tryout/Commitment Dates: - 14-and-under boys and girls (born July. 1, 2007, and after)

* First available date clubs can hold try-

outs: Oct. 2, 2021

* A player (regardless of whether they played for a club in the 2020-21 season) will not be required to commit to a club until 7 p.m. on Monday, Oct. 4.

* All offers made after 7:01 p.m. Oct. 4 are at the discretion of the club

- 15-and-older boys and girls (born June 30, 2007 and before)

First available date for tryouts: Nov. 13, 2021

A player (regardless of whether they played for a club in the 2020-21 season) will not be required to commit to a club until 7 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 15.

* All offers made after 7:01 p.m. Nov. 15 are at the discretion of the club

Best Practices for Tryouts - The Badger Region has compiled a list of Best Practices to be utilized before, during, and after tryouts. These will also be shared on our website, in our newsletter, and on social media.

We have asked club directors, coaches,

athletes and families to familiarize themselves with these Best Practices. The Best Practices were created by the Region's tryout committee consisting of region coaches, club directors, board members, and region staff.

Clubs will invite athletes to join their clubs via Sports Engine, just like they did for the 2020 season.

Parents and athletes should make sure that they have given their potential clubs the accurate email address and athlete information that corresponds to what is registered in Sports Engine.

All policies, dates, and supporting information will be posted to our website. The Badger Region recognizes that with the time missed this season and the unknown of what fall will bring, there may be some concerns and challenges related to tryouts.

How is the Badger Region Board structured?



Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.


Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.
