

FROM A BOARD MEMBER

Hello from the other side - a director's side

I was driving down the highway on my way home after a long day of tryouts and I couldn't help but be filled with gratitude. The nerves, the tension, the anticipation (in forms of both excitement and anxiety), and the time spent staring at the computer screen, marketing, making calls, and countless hours talking with parents and players were all showing to be worth it. Then the song "Hello" by Adele came on the radio and, of course like anyone would, I belt the lyrics in a celebration of the completion of tryouts.

It made me think about how I'd heard parents refer to the weekend of tryouts as one of the most stressful weekends of the year as they try to plan a way to hit multiple tryouts so their son or daughter has options to find the best possible fit for the upcoming club season. The players are dealing with nerves while trying to get adequate sleep, hydration, and nutrition. Players try to get in the best mindset possible while parents find the right balance



between supportive but not increasing pressure.

Then tryouts arrive, and the players give it their all while parents wait for hours dealing with the lack of control they have over what is happening in the gym at that time.

Tryouts can be stressful for players and parents, and I'd like to let you in on a little secret.... the "Other Side" is feeling it, too! This is where I thought of writing this piece as a "Hello from the other side." As club directors and coaches, we can't begin to express how humbled we are that you trust us with your child during

this time.

We totally understand that everyone wants the coveted "1's offer", but that isn't always the best fit, whether it's because of skill, position, or experience.

There are usually three reactions we typically get when offers are made. Those getting the 1's offers are excited, then there are those that didn't make the 1's team who are either disappointed they didn't make the team or just overjoyed that they made ANY team! So, as directors, we try to manage ALL of the emotions accordingly.

As parents and players come and go during the day of tryouts, the directors and coaches are there all day for multiple long tryout sessions, trying to remember tryout numbers, positions, ages, etc.

Whoever provides a meal during that day is a godsend, even though it's highly unlikely we get much more than a handful at a time, and sitting down to eat is almost unheard of. The process of tryouts is not only physically exhausting but mentally and emotionally exhausting for all parties.

Players and parents leave the gym to talk over their options,

and as for the directors... this was just another step in the process.

Now we wait "patiently" for the call, email, or text with the acceptance of an offer. If an offer is declined, we have another offer to make. The back and forth can go on for a long time as teams are completed.

At the end of it all, we (directors) are humbled, thankful, and honored that you chose our club into which we've put so much time, effort, blood, sweat, and tears. We struggle with the idea that we can't always provide a place for everyone to play and that we may not always be the best fit; but no matter what, we wish the very best to all the volleyball families out there!

Don't forget that the season is long, and we need to trust the process because there will be successes and failures and that is where the learning happens. These lessons will stick with you beyond volleyball if you embrace them.

A huge thank you to all the athletes, coaches, directors, families, and parents for all that you do for the love of volleyball!

NCAA unveils Division 1 women's volleyball bracket

The NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball committee announced the 64-team field that will compete in the 2021 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship on Sunday. Thirty-two conferences were awarded an automatic qualification, while the remaining 32 positions were filled with at-large selections to complete the bracket.

Louisville earned the top seed and will compete in the NCAA postseason after recording an undefeated regular season for the first time in program history and finishing with an overall record of 28-0.

Texas is the second seed, followed by No. 3 Pittsburgh and No. 4 Wisconsin. The top 16 teams are seeded nationally and placed within four regions. Per the established bracketing principles, the top 16 seeds were provided the opportunity to host. Additionally, team pairings were determined by geographic proximity, with the exception that teams from the same conference were not paired during the first-and second rounds.

The Big Ten led all conferences with eight teams selected from

the league to compete in the championship tournament. The Big-12 was second with seven programs advancing to the post season, followed by the ACC, The Pac-12, and Southeastern Conference who finished with six advancing programs.

First- and second-round matches will be played December 2-4 at 16 campus sites. Teams winning both matches will continue to regional play December 9 and 11. Regionals for the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship will be held at four non-predetermined

campus sites, which will be announced on December 5. At each site, four teams will compete in single- elimination regional semifinal competition.

The regional winners will advance to the national semifinals and championship final hosted by Ohio State University in conjunction with the Columbus Sports Commission December 16-18 at Nationwide Arena in Columbus, Ohio. The national semifinal matches will broadcast on ESPN, and the championship match will broadcast on ESPN2.

UW-Eau Claire wins D3 Women's Volleyball title

The University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire volleyball team competed in the program's first ever NCAA Division III Women's Volleyball Championship as they faced the sixth seeded, Calvin University Knights.

After a 2018 semifinals loss to the Knights, the Blugolds got their sweet revenge with a 3-0 sweep over Calvin for the program's first ever NCAA Division III National Title.

Arianna Barrett, Kendra Baierl, and Charlie Nelson were named to the NCAA Championship All-Tournement team. Barrett was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

With the National Title win, UW-Eau Claire finishes the season with a record of 34-3 and a 15-game win streak that will last for months and months to come.

Risen named Assistant Coach of the Year

The American Volleyball Coaches Association has announced Jodi Risen of the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire volleyball team has been named AVCA Division III Assistant Coach of the Year.

Risen, a former Blugold volleyball athlete herself, is in her 13th year with the UWEC coaching staff and has helped Eau Claire reach over 300 wins while on staff.

As a player, she led the team to a share of the WIAC Conference title in 2006 and to the Sweet Sixteen round of the NCAA tournament in 2005 and 2006.

Risen is the first WIAC Assistant Coach to receive the award since the award started in 2009.

Carthage to host D3 Championships

The Carthage Athletic Department announced last week that the college has been chosen to host the upcoming 2022 NCAA Division III Men's Volleyball Final Four and Championship, taking place on April 22-23, 2022.

"We're incredibly excited for this opportunity that our student-athletes, coaches, department, college, and the town of Kenosha can share in celebrating," said Director of Athletics Nate Stewart. "It will take plenty of work and planning, but we're prepared to host a national championship in Kenosha, and have the top-notch facilities and staff members to do it."

After a change from the originally planned location of Canton, Ohio, the bid for this coming spring's tournament was opened back up nationally, with Carthage earning the chance to host again after doing so in 2018.

"We are honored to host this year's NCAA Championship matches here at Carthage," said men's head volleyball coach JW Kieckhefer, who is also a Badger Region coach. "It is an exciting opportunity to showcase our sport to the Kenosha community and the greater Southeast-Wisconsin community. It is our hope this event will continue to grow boys volleyball in the state by bringing the greatest teams in the country to Kenosha. I could not be more excited for our city, college and program."

The Firebirds will look to repeat as NCAA National Champions after claiming the crown last spring. Led by all-Americans Zach Bulthuis, Gene McNulty, Matt Slivinski, and Carter Schmidt last year, Carthage ended the season with a 23-0 record, capping it off with a thrilling 3-2 win over Benedictine in the championship match.





How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they


think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
