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Shift to positive behavior by fans in sports must occur to retain officials

The National Federation of State High School Associations, the governing body of organizations such as the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association, offers this video as a reminder to fans, participants and officials.

NFHS CEO Karissa Niehoff says the boorish behavior of fans who attend sporting events is being normalized and even encouraged. A shift to positive behavior by fans in high school sports must occur if officials are going to be retained. Parents and other fans must come to high school games to cheer for their team's players -- not against the officials or opponents.

Spring/summer and USAV 'off-season' opportunities

After Badger Region Championships ended the first weekend in April, there are significantly fewer USAV Badger Region sanctioned events.

For a good number of Badger officials, this is the time their season winds down. For other officials, this is the time they extend their season and ramp up for some significant national tournaments. For every official, there are several growth opportunities and prep for other seasons that can occur in the spring/summer.

Some tips and opportunities below:

* Keep your ZebraWeb up to date for the few remaining Badger Region events. You can even look out to the *next* USAV season and block any known dates.



- * Look for opportunities outside of the Badger Region, including lots of Pre-National events in surrounding states
- * Several non-USAV sanctioned events often extend deeper in the season (May, June) and provide additional expe-

riences, in state and out of state.

* Boys and Girls Nationals are traditionally in June and July. These are required for National and Junior National officials but Regional officials are welcomed and considered during shortages.

Other "USAV Off-season" opportunities:

- * The USAV Academy online modules are a great resource to prep for any National events, as well as a self-paced season debrief for topics you came across during the USAV season.
- * WIAA, Wisconsin High School, officials registration is "open". Taking care of business early provides training and assignment opportunities. NFHS, the national high school umbrella organization provides some on-line training and rule interpretations. There are several high school volleyball associations that provide local training.
- * PAVO, Professional Association of Volleyball Officials, is a national organization that provides on-line training and on-court and classroom training delivered through a local board. PAVO is geared toward the NCAA, but there are many transferable skills and resources.
