The 2022 edition of the USA Volleyball Open National Championship has more than 300 teams with approximately 3,600 athletes registered to compete.

Dallas here we come

With the 2022 USA Volleyball Open National Championship in Orlando just days away, USA Volleyball announced that its 2023 Open National Championship will be May 26-31 at the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center in Dallas, Texas.

USA Volleyball will hold its annual meetings in Dallas ahead of the 2023 tournament and celebrate volleyball leaders and stars at the USA Volleyball Hall of Fame presented at the Dorothy C. Boyce Banquet.

The USA Volleyball Open National Championship, the

longest-running volleyball tournament in the United States, gives adult volleyball teams at every level a chance to compete against teams from around the country. Men's and women's teams with players ages 18-80 compete over the course of six days.

Milwaukee Dive wins silver

The Milwaukee Dive men's volleyball team took home second place at the Volleyball League of American (VLA) Cup May 13-15 in Angola. Ind.

Dive is made up of Badger Region members and has a majority of athletes who grew up in Wisconsin or played collegiately in Wisconsin on its roster. Team members recently ran a boys youth clinic on April 23 in Kenosha, Wis.

Milwaukee Dive is a Tier 2 team that places in the Central Division of the VLA against teams that include Chicago Sweed, Madison Inferno, 630 Slunkers and MICA. With its silver medal, the team will be moved up to Tier 1 where it will compete with Team Pineapple (led by former Olympian Lloy Ball) and Chicago Icemen.

The VLA has an Eastern, Central and Western Division that compete in three events each per year before playing in the VLA Cup at the end of the season.

USA Volleyball names women's VNL roster

USA Volleyball has announced the U.S. Women's National Team's 25-athlete roster for Volleyball Nations League (VNL) 2022.

The U.S. Women are the threetime defending VNL champions as well as the 2020 Olympic gold medalists and the No. 1-ranked team

in the world. The U.S. Women's first preliminary VNL round will be May 31-June 5 at Brookshire Grocery Arena in Bossier City, La.

They will move on to play preliminary rounds in Quezon City, Philippines and Calgary, Canada. The finals will be July 13-17 in Ankara, Turkey.

Karch Kiraly, in his 10th year as Women's National Team head coach, will lead the team along with assistant coaches Erin Virtue, Tama Miyashiro and Alfee Reft.

"We are excited to return to competition and begin a new Olympic cycle, especially since we get to host the first phase of the 2022 VNL in Shreveport/ Bossier City, Louisiana," said U.S. Women's Head Coach Karch Kiraly. "We've got a great range of experience, from Olympians to people spending their first time with our program. And finally, we're eager to face the unknowns, and see what lessons this group can gather from battling the strong teams of the world."

Eight players on the roster return from the group that won the VNL Final Round in 2021 and later that summer took the gold medal at the Olympic Games in Tokyo: setters Micha Hancock and Jordyn Poulter, middle blockers Chiaka Ogbogu and Haleigh Washington, opposites Annie Drews and Jordan Thompson, outside hitter Kelsey Robinson and libero Justine Wong-Orantes.

VNL newcomers are setter Jenna Gray, middles Brionne Butler and Anna Stevenson, opposite Nia Reed, outsides Kara Bajema, Dani

Drews and Ali Frantti and liberos Morgan Hentz and Kendall White.

Men's VNL roster has new faces, lots of talent

USA Volleyball has revealed the 25-player U.S. Men's National Team roster for the Volleyball Nations League (VNL) 2022.

Fourteen players from the long list will be chosen for each week's travel roster. The U.S. Men will open the VNL Preliminary Round in Brasilia, Brazil, before moving on to Sofia, Bulgaria, and Osaka, Japan.

The men's VNL Final Round will be July 20-24 in Bologna, Italy.

Head Coach John Speraw, in his 10th year, will lead the team with assistant coaches Matt Fuerbringer and Mike Wall.

"There is good young talent on this roster, especially at outside hitter, that we are excited to evaluate early in VNL," Speraw said. "This is an opportunity for them to show if they can help us win VNL matches and if they can make a World Championship roster down the summer."

Eight players on the roster return from the team that competed at the Tokyo Olympic Games in 2021: setter Micah Christenson; libero Erik Shoji; opposite Kyle Ensing; middle blockers David



Smith and Mitch Stahl; and out-

side hitters T.J. DeFalco, Thomas Jaeschke and Garrett Muagututia.

Newcomers to the VNL roster are setters James Shaw and Quinn Isaacson; middles Patrick Gasman, Merrick McHenry and Tyler Mitchem; outside hitters Cody Kessel, Jacob Pasteur, Will Rottman and Brett Wildman; and libero Mason Briggs.

Six of the newcomers plan to return to their college teams in the fall: Outside hitters Olivier (LBSU), Pasteur (Ohio State), Rottman (Stanford) and Wildman (Penn State), middle blocker McHenry (UCLA) and libero Briggs (LBSU).

"At the beginning of every quad, there's an opportunity to look at young players who could be Team

USA contributors," Speraw said. "There is a short period before the Paris Olympic Games, and this is the time for us to evaluate young talent."

The U.S. Men are ranked No. 7 in the world. They placed seventh at the 2021 VNL after finishing second in 2019.

Leaders in volleyball to be honored at Hall of Fame

USA Volleyball Gulf Coast Region Commissioner Philip Bryant has been added to the prestigious list of those who will be honored at the at the 2022 USA Volleyball Hall of Fame ceremony at the Dorothy C. Boyce Banquet on May 25 in Orlando, Fla.

The May event at the Rosen Centre will be the first in-person USA Volleyball Hall of Fame ceremony since 2019. Tickets are available at 2022 USA Volleyball Hall of Fame.

Bryant (AKA Coach Bryant), a leader in the drive to make beach volleyball an NCAA sport, will receive the George J. Fisher Leader in Volleyball Award, which recognizes longtime significant contributions to volleyball programs and activities as a player, coach, official, leader and/or administrator for at least 20 years.

Among others added to the list of honorees: John Hughes, commissioner of the USAV Western Empire Region in western New York, will receive the Dr. Neville A. "Doc" Booth Commissioner's Award.

Liz Masakayan, a 1988 indoor Olympian and international beach champion, will be named All-Time Great Female Beach Athlete.

The All-Time Great Male Beach Athlete award will go to two-time world champion Sinjin Smith.

Four-time Olympian and gold medalist Phil Dalhausser will be honored as the 2021 National Team Male Athlete of the Year.



How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.
