Athletes will gain insight into what it takes to succeed at the highest level and get advice and motivation to achieve their goals with unlimited access to more than 38 courses and 204 modules. "Our philosophy within the NTDP is to educate the complete athlete," said USA Volleyball Chief of Sport Peter Vint. "The NTDP Academy allows athletes to learn new mental and physical skills on-demand in the comfort of their home."

Besides athletes and coaches, the Academy also offers advice and lessons from U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Committee sport-performance staff on subjects such as weight training, nutrition and sport psychology. The well-rounded curriculum is based on the five pillars of the USA Volleyball Development Model: craft, body, mind, heart and team.

Minneapolis to host BJNC in 2025

USA Volleyball announced that Minneapolis will host the 2025 Boys Junior National Championship on July 3-10 at the Minneapolis Convention Center.

As was previously announced, the 2023 BJNC will be June 29-July 6 in Salt Lake City and the 2024 BJNC will go to Dallas on June 26-July 3.

The BJNC is the United States' premier junior boys club tournament for athletes ages 12-18 and attracts the most elite athletes and college scouts from across the country

"Minneapolis has long been one of our most popular event destinations," said USA Volleyball President and CEO Jamie Davis. "I know our athletes and their families and fans will enjoy their time in this great Midwestern city."

The 46th edition of the BJNC is expected to bring thousands of athletes, coaches and supporters to Minneapolis resulting in an economic boost.

"Sports Minneapolis and the Minneapolis Convention Center have a rich tradition of hosting national volleyball tournaments and we are excited to add to that legacy by hosting the 2025 USA Volleyball Boys Junior Nationals," said Matt Meunier, director of Sports Minneapolis. "We look forward to welcoming thousands of boys' volleyball players, coaches and fans to our city and showcasing everything that Minneapolis has to offer during our spectacular summer season."

Patti Dawson wins USAV's Silver Whistle Award

Longtime Badger Region official Patti Dawson received USA Volleyball's Silver Whistle Award on Thursday, May 26, 2022, in advance of the Open National Championships in Orlando, Fla.

This award recognizes the individual deemed as the most outstanding rookie referee of the year from the previous year's USA Open Championship Event.

The criteria for the award requires the official to referee a minimum of eight matches at a United States Open Championship event as a USA National Referee in his/her first assignment at this level following certification at this rating.

Looking back

Like many coaches, Dawson first started officiating when she started coaching in the early 1990s.

Now, 30 years later, Dawson continues to coach both players and referees in the Badger Region.

"My contribution that means the most to me is when I can mentor a newer official and give them some of the feedback and tip I've gotten along the way," Dawson said. "Hopefully shar-



ing my love of the sport with them."

A resident and native of New Berlin, Wisconsin, Dawson earned her Junior National certification in 2015 and her National Certification in 2019. She is currently a national scorer certification candidate. Dawson credits her many mentors along the way for her success and admits she is "scared to miss someone." Some of her mentors she has looked up to along the way include Pati Rolf, Dale Rohde, Jim Momsen and Jim Arts.

"I honestly learn something from everyone I cross paths with," she said.

Her goals as a National Official are to give back to her fellow officials in any way possible and to continue to learn and grow in her craft.

Dawson, who is a proud owner of horses and dogs, recently became a grandmother and continues to also work with youths in the Badger Region, most recently coaching the Midwest Penguins G11s in the 2020-21 season.

What's her favorite memory? She said, "Anytime I get positive feedback from players, coaches or parents, that becomes a favorite memory!"

Dawson tells newer officials that to be the best they can, they should focus on being consistent, professional and kind at all times. "And learn something from every match you officiate," she said.



No tryouts for beach. Everyone plays. That's right. Simply sign up and play. No

camps. clinics. drills required.



actually playing volleyball.

Are there specialized positions in beach?

Nope. Only a left and a right side. Most beach plavers are well-rounded and can hit, dig and block.

Do you wear kneepads?

On the sand it's not common. If you have had knee injuries or you just



feel most comfortable diving for shots with pads on, then

you should not hesitate to wear knee pads or a knee brace while playing.

Are beach courts the same size as indoor?

Beach doubles courts are much smaller. Indoor courts are 60' x 30' and beach courts are 26'3 x 52'6. A smaller court ensures rallies will last longer.



EXCITED TO PLAY

Beach volleyball has become one of the most popular summertime activities. Why play beach volleyball? Well, it's fun! Benefits of the sport include conditioning, cardiovascular exercise, improved agility, and provides outdoor social activity.

Traditionally when athletes are first playing in the sand, they need to get their "sand legs." Many athletes



forcing guick position changes using muscles which are often neglected. Over time sand volleyball players develop excellent endurance and

stamina.

Getting outside is really good for mental and physical health. Beach volleyball provides the opportunity to get outside, enjoy some fresh air, exercise, and make new friends. Get a group of kids together, grab a court at a local park and play. Pick up games can be great for kids who are new to the game.

ADVICE FROM THE EXPERTS

Olympian April Ross said there is one big difference



going from the indoor game to the beach. "It's the mental endurance. "You can't

have any mental letdown. You have to approach each one with intensity and emotion."

When asked if he believes indoor players should also play sand volleyball, former Stan-



ford University women's coach John Dunning says yes and that "playing sand can help a player

in a variety of ways, including enjoying the game for a longer time and benefiting from the mental aspect of playing on a two-person team."

INDOOR VS. OHTDOOR DIFFERENCES

Outdoors: Beach/grass/sand rule

Games played to 21 points

Playing conditions (wind, sun, texture of the sand) are up to Mother Nature to decide. That's why you switch sides every seven points

Teams consist of two players. There's no bench and no substitutions. Once you step on the court, you don't get to leave until the game is decided

Very tight rules on double contacts - therefore you'll see less overhand setting taking place. No setting is allowed on first contact

Beach players must use their palm, locked or curled fingers to hit a short shot over the net

You can penetrate under the net provided you do not interfere with your opponent



Antennas are rarely used except in pro competition. In the absence of antennas, the posts act as antennas for all purposes except player contact

Indoor volleyball rule Games played to 25

Athletes don't have weather to contend with. You've got four walls, a roof and good lighting

Indoors, you have six athletes on the court at one time and bench players who can sub in (in addition to a libero).

Rules regarding double contacts (especially on first contacts) are more relaxed to allow for longer rallies

Open-hand tips are allowed.

Center line violations can occur if an athlete causes a safety risk or gains an advantage going past the center line

Indoor rules strictly stipulate the use of antennas to define the crossing space over the net.

Kerri Walsh Jennings heads Hall of Fame class

The International Volleyball Hall of Fame (IVHF) has announced its induction class of 2022. This history-making class spans a vast range of accomplishments, expertise, and history and will be enshrined on Saturday, Oct. 22, in Holyoke, Mass.

The 36th Induction class includes six honorees for the 2022 class: four-time beach Olympian and three-time gold medal winner Kerri Walsh Jennings (United States); all-time great indoor Brazilian Men's and Women's coach Bernardo "Bernardinho" Rezende (Brazil); founder and first president of World ParaVolley, Pieter Joon (Netherlands), who will become the first inductee in the ParaVolley category; four-time indoor Olympian and winner of two silver and two bronze medals, Samuele Papi (Italy); threetime indoor Olympian and bronze medal winner, Fernanda Venturini (Brazil); and former Technical Director of the Dutch Federation and FIVB Technical Committee member for 30 years, Peter Murphy (Netherlands), inducted as a leader.

"This is a remarkable class of inductees for 2022," said IVHF President Steve Bishop, also the President of the Florida Region of USA Volleyball. "On behalf of the IVHF Board of Directors, we look forward to welcoming these legends and their families to Holyoke for the celebration of the year. It is a special moment to watch each inductee reflect on their respective



careers as they are celebrated for their many accomplishments and contributions to our sport. We invite the entire volleyball family to join us for this year's event."

All told, the IVHF has inducted 155 individuals from 25 countries into its historic Hall of Fame – those totals will rise to 161 inductees after the 2022 event, including the first-ever inductee in the ParaVolley category.

"All eyes will be on Holyoke this October" noted IVHF Executive Director George Mulry. "We are excited to honor this history-making class featuring one of the most dominant beach players to ever grace the sand, the first-ever inductee in the ParaVolley category, leaders on the court, the sidelines and on the cutting edge of the game. This class covers it all and is sure to make for quite an emotional Induction Ceremony."

The 2022 International Volleyball Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will take place in Holyoke on Oct. 22. Ticket packages are available online at <u>VolleyHall.org/Induction-Cel-</u> ebration.



How is the Badger Region Board structured?


The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fouryear terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
