# **Big winners at USAV Championships**

### Three Badger Region girls teams win national titles in Indianapolis

Badger Region's drought is over. For year's the Region has gone without a title in a junior division of the USA Volleyball National Championship.

Now thanks to Milwaukee Sting and FC Elite volleyball clubs, Wisconsin is h

Nationa onship in Indianapolis was MKE Sting 14-White. The team had high expectations coming into the 14-Patriot Division of the

tournament as the group was seeded No. 2 in the 39-team field.

They proved they were deserving of their high ranking by going 11-0 in matches and 22-2 in sets at the four-day event.

On the final day, Sting defeated TAV Houston 14-Molten (2-0) from the Lone Star Region in the quarterfinals, 14E Mash (2-1) from the Ohio Valley Region in the semifinals and T-Street 14-Alicia (2-0) from the Southern California Region in the finals.

The Patriot Division does not require teams to qualify to participate in this division.

Later in the week, the older athletes arrived in Indianapolis and the success continued to roll in.

FC Elite 16-Navy, who earned their bid at the Badger Region Qualifier on Feb. 27, came into the 16-National Division seeded 10th out of 48 teams.

Their lone loss on the weekend was in the last match of pool play against HJV 16-Elite from the Lone Star Region.

After earning their spot in the Gold Bracket, FC Elite overcame three three-set matches to win the title.

In the quarterfinals, the team defeated Absolute 16-Black from the Northern California Region 16-14 in the third set. In the semifinals, FC Elite beat Maverick 16-Elite from the Ohio

Valley Region 2-1. And in the finals, the team defeated Six Pack 16 from the Iowa Region 2-1.

FC Elite 16 Navy finished the tournament with a record of 10-1 and 21-6 in sets.

Wrapping up the week in Indianapolis, MKE Sting 17 Gold dropped only one match and three sets in route to the championship of the 17-National Division.

Once they earned their spot in the Gold Bracket, the team defeated OJVA 17-1 Gold from the Columbia Empire Region in the quarterfinals, Union 17-1 UA from the Palmetto Region in the semifinals and 1st Alliance 17 Silver from the Great Lakes Region in the finals.

MKE Sting 17 Gold qualified at the Badger Region Qualifier on Feb. 27.

The National Division is the second-highest division and is reserved for the top team from each Region who did not earn an Open bid at a Girls National Qualifier Tournament.

In addition, the MKE Sting 16-Lightning boys team brought home the title in the 16 Club Division in the Orlando championships. While the event was not Badger Region/USAV sanctioned, all of the athletes and coaches on the Sting 16-Lighting team are Badger Region members.

# **Recruiting Tip of the Week** The 411 On Scholarships

Summer is camp season, and volleyball camps offer an excellent chance for players who think they might want to play in college to showcase their talents. These camps also provide a way for players and their families to learn what it takes to be a college athlete and the differences between NCAA levels.

Players and their families should take advantage of every opportunity to find out more. A common question asked at these camps is how are scholarships administered in each NCAA division and other institutional options. Here are the basics:

NCAA	Type of Scholarship	Amount (fully funded)	Stackable
DI	Headcount	12	NO
DII	Equivalency	8	YES
DIII	No athletic	0	Just academic

The Headcount model: If there are 16 players on the team, athletic scholarship money only funds only 12 individual players. A fully funded program has 12 scholarships, and if a D1 school is not fully funded then they will have less "full-ride" scholarships and move to the equivalency model below. The full-ride scholarship will pay for almost everything at collegetuition, fees, room and board, etc. Based on the school, there may be costs the athlete will have to pay out of pocket. The remaining four players on the team will be considered walk-ons, and they may still qualify for academic scholarships.

The Equivalency model: Here, funding for a total of eight scholarships is available for student-athletes in the program. The amount of money available per school will differ, but it all has to equal the cost of eight full-ride scholarships if they are fully funded. If they aren't fully funded, then they will have less total scholarships. Coaches determine how to disburse the pool of scholarship dollars. Players or other funding sources have to cover the remaining costs.

The Stackable model: Student-athletes are eligible to receive both athletic scholarship and academic scholarship money. Players with strong academic records can often accumulate enough scholarship money from these two sources to significantly lower the cost of attending college.

#### **Other College Divisions/Levels:**

Level	Type of Scholarship	Amount (fully funded)	Stackable
NAIA	Equivalency	8	Aid to athlete
NJCAA DI	Full (tuition and room/board)	Depends on school	Depends on school
NJCAA DII	Tuition only (no room/board)	Depends on school	Depends on school
NJCAA DIII	No athletic money	0	NO

The Aid to Athlete model: The NAIA combines the athletic and academic aid an individual institution gives out, and all financial aid counts towards the volleyball programs equivalency. The equivalency only measures the student-athletes who participate on the varsity team. There are exemptions for those with a GPA higher than 3.5. If a student has a 3.5 GPA and in the top 25% of their class, their scholarship is considered half of a scholarship in equivalency. If a student has a 3.75 GPA and in the top 10% of their class their scholarship is considered fully exempted from counting in the team's equivalency.

In the final analysis, deciding if and where to play college volleyball can often be very challenging. The availability of scholarships is an essential part of that decision, but not the only one. Choosing a college and volleyball program should also be based on the right competitive level for your abilities and aspirations, the academic and S. Region student life experiences that fit your needs, and finding a volleyball program culture that most appeals to your personality and values.



Nope. Only a left and a right side. Most beach plavers are well-rounded and can hit, dig and block.

#### Do you wear kneepads?

On the sand it's not common. If you have had knee injuries or you just



feel most comfortable diving for shots with pads on, then

you should not hesitate to wear knee pads or a knee brace while playing.

#### Are beach courts the same size as indoor?

Beach doubles courts are much smaller. Indoor courts are 60' x 30' and beach courts are 26'3 x 52'6. A smaller court ensures rallies will last longer.



EXCITED TO PLAY

Beach volleyball has become one of the most popular summertime activities. Why play beach volleyball? Well, it's fun! Benefits of the sport include conditioning, cardiovascular exercise, improved agility, and provides outdoor social activity.

Traditionally when athletes are first playing in the sand, they need to get their "sand legs." Many athletes



forcing guick position changes using muscles which are often neglected. Over time sand volleyball players develop excellent endurance and

stamina.

Getting outside is really good for mental and physical health. Beach volleyball provides the opportunity to get outside, enjoy some fresh air, exercise, and make new friends. Get a group of kids together, grab a court at a local park and play. Pick up games can be great for kids who are new to the game.

#### ADVICE FROM THE EXPERTS

Olympian April Ross said there is one big difference



going from the indoor game to the beach. "It's the mental endurance. "You can't

have any mental letdown. You have to approach each one with intensity and emotion."

When asked if he believes indoor players should also play sand volleyball, former Stan-



ford University women's coach John Dunning says yes and that "playing sand can help a player

in a variety of ways, including enjoying the game for a longer time and benefiting from the mental aspect of playing on a two-person team."

#### INDOOR VS. OHTDOOR DIFFERENCES

#### Outdoors: Beach/grass/sand rule

#### Games played to 21 points

Playing conditions (wind, sun, texture of the sand) are up to Mother Nature to decide. That's why you switch sides every seven points

Teams consist of two players. There's no bench and no substitutions. Once you step on the court, you don't get to leave until the game is decided

Very tight rules on double contacts - therefore you'll see less overhand setting taking place. No setting is allowed on first contact

#### Beach players must use their palm, locked or curled fingers to hit a short shot over the net

You can penetrate under the net provided you do not interfere with your opponent



Antennas are rarely used except in pro competition. In the absence of antennas, the posts act as antennas for all purposes except player contact

#### Indoor volleyball rule Games played to 25

Athletes don't have weather to contend with. You've got four walls, a roof and good lighting

Indoors, you have six athletes on the court at one time and bench players who can sub in (in addition to a libero).

Rules regarding double contacts (especially on first contacts) are more relaxed to allow for longer rallies

#### Open-hand tips are allowed.

Center line violations can occur if an athlete causes a safety risk or gains an advantage going past the center line

Indoor rules strictly stipulate the use of antennas to define the crossing space over the net.



# How is the Badger Region Board structured?


The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fouryear terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
