John Nelson shares his 'JN' reffing experience


When I started officiating many years ago I was an active duty Marine stationed in Yakima, WA. I played on a USVBA, now USAV, men's team and my coach was a USVBA National Official. My coach and another Junior National Official mentored me and during my second season I earned my Regional patch.

As a Marine I moved every three to four years and that meant going to different regions. Each time, I would move I kept my Regional patch but it meant having to prove my abilities as an official because each region can have a different process to get your Regional rating.

My solution to avoid this was to get my Junior National rating. Having a Junior National rating meant anywhere you went the region knew what level of evaluation you had been through to get your patch. I let the officials chair in my region know that I wanted to advance to Junior National and the region worked to put me in challenging matches and provided training to me to prepare me for the rating session.

In 1998, I traveled to Dallas to attend the Girl's Junior National Championships as a Junior National Referee candidate. We worked matches as R1 and R2 with other candidates and were debriefed after each match by our raters who were all National Officials. I earned my Junior National patch there and still remember many of those that earned their patches there. It is a time where lifelong friendships can be made and I feel fortunate that I still get to work with one of the others from that group.

When you travel to a tournament outside of the region as a Junior National official, tournament directors



may not know you but they know the rating process you have been through and know what level of matches you can handle. Having your Junior National may mean a little extra pay per match, and it can open the door to some different very fun tournaments. In your region it gives you additional experience to be a mentor to younger officials. Over the years, I have had so many great mentors that one of the things I wish to do is to spend more time in the region working with young officials to help them gain experience. It can also be a way to get college assignors to see you work and open the door to college assignments.

As I start year 34 as a USAV official, I feel that tough things can still happen in your matches but upper level officials many times make them seem easy to deal with because of the training they have been through. As a younger official have you had what you thought would be a tough match seem easy because you had a Junior National or National official as a partner. Are you ready to become that partner to make the match go smoother?

BACKGROUND SCREENINGS

All adult staff members require a full background screening that includes the following:

- * Social Security Number validation;
- * Name and address history records:

* Two independent Multi-Jurisdictional Criminal Database searches covering 50 states plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;

* Federal District Courts search for each name used and district where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable:

* County Criminal Records for each name used and county where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable for each county searched:

* National Sex Offender Registry database search of all available states, plus DC. Guam. and Puerto Rico;

- * Multiple National Watch Lists;
- * SafeSport Disciplinary Records;

* Comprehensive International Records search for U.S. citizens who have lived outside of the United States for six consecutive months in any one country, during the past seven years;

* Motor Vehicle Records of at least a 3-year history in the state of licensure; (if driving is required for position).
