The Badger Region is hosting a "Last-Chance Tryout" from 3 to 5 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 9, at the New Berlin SportsPlex, 2900 S 163rd St, New Berlin, and all club directors are invited to attend.

"The Last-Chance Tryout & Clinic" is part of the Region's effort to help all athletes find a home for the 2022-23 club volleyball season.

The free event will be run by the Badger Region staff with help from ambassadors assigned by the Region. The Region will coordinate all things — including the registration process as well as the drills being done on the court. A list of athletes, their height, position(s), dominant hand, hometown, age and appropriate email address would be shared with club directors in attendance.

Coaches will not be able to make offers on site. They will be allowed to talk to parents who are in attendance while drills are going on. But any actual paperwork, emails, etc. that contain an official offer should be done electronically after the event.

On-court and off-court performance matters

What are college coaches actually watching at tournaments?

I have had multiple conversations about this with our current players, asking them to think back to when they were getting recruited. What they were thinking when they saw college coaches walk past their court when they had just whiffed their first warmup swing in the net? Or when they knew someone was coming to watch their match and they couldn't focus during warmup because they were scanning the crowd for that one face?

Yes, there is an aspect to the experience of recruiting that is nerve racking; however, when I explain to my players what we were actually looking for, they often say they wish they had known those things before.

This will not be the same for every program, but here is an overview of what our staff is looking for when recruiting: execution, potential and current interactions—both on and off the court—during tournaments. Let me expand:

On the court

How you move! Yes, we want to see you get kills and pass dimes, but we are really watching how you move. We are looking at your ability to hold explosive load in your hips, knees, and



core. We are watching your ability to accelerate through an approach or a floor move. We are looking at your jump mechanics and how you involve your arms while you are jumping. We are watching the speed of your arm and if it increases as you finish your arm swing.

How you connect with the people around you! You spend a lot of time with your teammates and coaches in college, so recruiting is just as much finding the right person as it is the best athlete. It is my promise to my current team that we will find athletes who will both honor what they have built and add to it. I look for this in how you interact with your teammates in good and bad moments. I am also watching how you interact with your coaches in tense and relaxed moments. These interactions will likely mirror how you will be in our program. They tell me a lot.

How you compete! I want to see if there are moments where you are attentive to detail. How you respond after an error or what you do on game point. I also want to see if the stress created by pressure causes you to interact differently with those around you and if those differences help or hurt your team.

Body language! What are you saying when you are saying nothing? Does your body language add to your play/team environment or take away from it?

Joy! Are you enjoying yourself? College volleyball requires a lot and being able to enjoy the playing piece of it is crucial in growth mindset and in preventing burn out. I would also like to point out that joy looks different for different players, but I believe it is a visible part of competing.

Off the court

Bench interactions! What are you like on the bench? Are you giving energy? Are you engaged in the game or looking at the mini donut stand across the way? Are you a learner of the game and a giver of information to other people in your position?

Huddles! Are you listening during huddles? Are you engaged in your team's strategy and mindset?

Other interactions! How are you interacting with other people at the tournament? Do you engage with the janitors or people working concessions? How are you with your parents? Are you getting your own snacks or yelling at your mom to do that for you?

As I said above, we are still looking for terminal athletes with high athletic ceilings. However, the detail we are assessing while recruiting is much deeper than that. We are looking for additional qualities that will improve our program in many ways.

Now that you know this about at least one program, I hope it gives you new perspective for your next tournament or even your upcoming season. Trust that preparing well, giving to those around you, and competing hard will put you in the best place to be seen by the right school.

Girls 11-13s nationals headed to Dallas in 2024

USA Volleyball has selected Dallas to host the 2024 Girls Junior National Championship (GJNC) for the 11-13 age divisions.

USA Volleyball recently announced it is splitting the Girls Junior National Championship beginning in 2023 and having one tournament for the 11-13 age divisions and one for 14-17. This creates more competitive opportunities for athletes and clubs and increases the number

of venues that can host.

The GJNC (11-13s) tournament will be June 21-24 at the Kay Bailey Hutchinson Convention Center (KBHCC). It will run right before the 2024 Boys Junior National Championship, which will be at the KBHCC on June 26-July 3.

"The city of Dallas has been a great event partner for us over the years, and I am excited that two of our 2024 National Championships will be held there," said Jamie Davis, president and CEO of USA Volleyball. "Dallas is an exciting and diverse city with plenty for our teams, families and supporters to see and do. I want to thank the Dallas Sports Commission and the North Texas Region for their support. These events will provide a large economic impact to the city."

"Dallas proves time and time again that we are an ideal market for youth volleyball," said Monica Paul, Executive Director of the Dallas Sports Commission. "We're delighted to have the chance to welcome the 2024 Girls Junior National Championship to our city alongside our partners with USA Volleyball."

Teams will compete in 10 divisions at the GJNC (11-13s): 11 National; 12 National, USA and American; and 13 Open, National, USA, Liberty, American and Patriot.

BACKGROUND SCREENINGS

All adult staff members require a full background screening that includes the following:

- * Social Security Number validation;
- * Name and address history records:
- * Two independent Multi-Jurisdictional Criminal Database searches covering 50 states plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;
- * Federal District Courts search for each name used and district where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable;
- * County Criminal Records for each name used and county where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable for each county searched:
- * National Sex Offender Registry database search of all available states, plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;
- * Multiple National Watch Lists;
- * SafeSport Disciplinary Records;
- * Comprehensive International Records search for U.S. citizens who have lived outside of the United States for six consecutive months in any one country, during the past seven years;
- * Motor Vehicle Records of at least a 3-year history in the state of licensure; (if driving is required for position).



Players who were born on or after July 1, 2003 and a high school student in the twelfth (12) grade or below during some part of the current academic year are eligible to compete in 18 & under.

*Female Only - Players who were born on or after July 1, 2004, (who are defined as 18 & under by the USAY Age Definition) and are in the 11th grade for the current academic year are watered to consider a rest in the 2015 and the 18% of the 18

**Male Only - Players who were from en or after July 1, 2008 QR players who were born on or after July 1, 2007 (15 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the eighth (8th igrade during the current academic year are eligible to play in the 14 & Under division. This exception is based on the net height difference of 74 1/8" to 7"11 5/8" between the 14 and Linder Division to the 15 and Linder Division.

*Male Only - Players who were born on or after July 1, 2008 (14 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the seventh grade (7th) during the current academic year are eligible for a Region approved waiver to compete in the boys 13's age group.

Male Only -Players who were born on or after July 1, 2009 [13 years or younger] who shall residen have completed nor are in a grade higher than the sixth grade (6th) during the current academic year are eligible for a Region approved waiver to compete in the boys 12's age group.



Tips for athletes and families for tryouts

Use this checklist to make sure you have all your ducks in a row as it pertains to things such as memberships, tryouts and more.

Memberships

The first step to tryouts is making sure you have a current Badger Region membership. Only a tryout membership or full membership are accepted for tryouts. Tryout memberships can be upgraded to the full membership after an athlete receives an offer from a club. For a link to junior membership options, click here. As a heads up, parents must create a free profile and then purchase the junior membership in their athlete's name.

Refunds

The Badger Region does not offer refunds on memberships. Please make sure to purchase the correct membership for yourself, your son or your daughter before Post-tryouts clicking "buy." Information on a member's profile cannot be transferred to another member if a wrong purchase is made. That includes situations where mom buys a membership for herself, but meant to buy it for her son or daughter.

Membership Cards

Users will receive an email confirmation when they purchase a Badger Region/USA Volleyball membership. On that email is a copy of your member card that you can print. 10 musts at every tryout

- 1. Show up early. Give yourself plenty of time to go through the checkin lines, get your tryout t-shirt and warmup on your own.
- 2. Show a lot of hustle. If that means shagging a volleyball or bringing it in for a team huddle, never be least.
- 3. Keep your eyes open and your ears tuned in to anyone giving instruction. Evaluators want to see you engaged and absorbing instructions that are being given by the coaching staff.
- 4. Be coachable. If a coach asks you try something, gift it your all. Don't given him or her an excuse as to why you can't do it or say, "That's not what I was told before."
- 5. Be vocal. Coaches want to hear you call the ball, identify hitters and do all the little things while also being a great teammate.
- 6. Cheer for your teammates more than you celebrate your own success. Showing that you care for the team's success more than your own will really catch the coaches' eye.
- 7. Shake it off. If you let a bad serve, set, pass or swing remain with you, coaches will notice. Just get ready to move on to the next play.
- 8. Ask questions. If you don't understand a drill or want to clarify what you heard, do it. Don't be afraid to speak up.
- 9. Be a leader. Have an open court? Get a game going without being told to do so. Nobody stepping in to be a middle? Just go for it even if you're nervous.
 - 10. Believe in yourself. Be your own advocate and do what is best for you.

What NOT to do at tryouts

- 1. Don't give your setter a hard time. Got blocked? Hit out? Shake it off and move on without placing blame.
- 2. Don't bring your cell phone into the gym. Coaches don't want to see you texting when you should be concentrating on volleyball.
- 3. Don't form cliques. Be sure to rotate who your partner is for drills and invite new people into your group.
- 4. Don't ever quit on a ball, even if you know it's unlikely that you'll get to it. Even in pepper! Coaches want players who give their all on every ball.
- 5. Don't talk when the coach is talking, it's disrespectful and sends a bad message to the coach.
- 6. Don't do anything halfway. Lazy footwork on free balls, not covering the hitter, walking to shag balls, etc. Give your all whenever you're in the gym.
- 7. Don't pay attention to your parents on the sidelines. No conversations or gestures. Coaches want to focus on the player, not the parent.
- 8. Don't carry a mistake with you into the next play. A coach can tell by your body language if you're not over being blocked on the previous point.
- 9. Don't be resistant to stepping into another position, even if it's not the one you're trying out for. Coaches want players who can adjust and are willing to be versatile.
- 10. Don't give off a negative vibe. Look like you're having fun playing the game. Smile, be upbeat, support your teammates, and enjoy yourself. Coaches like players who bring positive energy to the court.

Bonus: Don't show up for a tryout wearing a t-shirt from different club.



How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they

think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
