## What does it mean to be a Junior National certified official?

It means you are recognized by USA Volleyball as a referee that is qualified to officiate at national events. More importantly, it means you put in the time and effort to get good enough to obtain that recognition.

\* Seeking out feedback from better, more experienced officials.

\* Processing the feedback, understanding it, and applying it to how you officiate.

What motivated me to pursue Junior National certification?

I sought Junior National-certification to become a better official; I knew the pursuit of it would accomplish that.

Volleyball is a great game. I enjoyed it as a player, and I enjoy it now as an official. What I don't enjoy is knowing that a match could have gone more smoothly if I had handled a situation differently or didn't make a mental/focus error. I don't dwell on those situations, but I do what I can to learn from them so that the next time I'm on the stand, or in front of the score table, the teams and coaches on my court have a better official than the last time I officiated for them.

#### Parting thoughts:

There is a culture of continuous improvement among many high-level, accomplished officials. A culture in knowing that there is something to be learned from every match and from other officials. A culture in which you listen to and accept feedback. A culture in which you take the time to respectfully give feedback. All of this to help make each other better officials. If you subscribe to and want to be a part of this culture, then I encourage you to reach out to an official you respect and ask if they could observe you and give you some feedback.

# Officials help WIAA celebrate Title IX

The WIAA celebrated the 50th anniversary of Title IX, which has helped pave the way for women in athletics. One of the ways they celebrated was to have all high level female officiating crews for championship Saturday of the WIAA State Tournament.

Jody Witty, a WIAA and USAV Regional official was selected to be the R1 of the WIAA boys final.

"I was honored to be asked not only to be a part of the WIAA state volleyball championships but also to officiate the boys final," Witty said. "Thanks to all of those who have fought to give me these opportunities and memories in sports past, present and future."

"Jody is highly regarded in the Badger Region and has been and excellent mentor to those who are just starting out in officiating," said Badger Region officials assigner Sara Voigt. Eileen Alt, a WIAA official and a USAV Junior National Official was the R1 for the girls D3 state finals.

"It was such an honor to be selected to officiate at the WIAA State Volleyball Tournament and be a part of the all-female crew for the 50th Anniversary of Title IX," Alt said.

"Eileen is such a wonderful person and a very





skilled official who is always willing to help," Voigt said. "She donated a TON of officials gear including bags, flags, whistles, lanyards and apparel so we can give them to beginning officials."

Lexi Sheldon, a WIAA official and a USAV National Official had the opportunity to R1 the girls D1 state finals.

"She officiated a great match with high level competition and held her composure well with extreme confidence," Voigt said, who helped line judge the match. "It was amazing to watch her on the stand and I was so proud of her. She called a great match."


### MEMBERSHIP COSTS BREAKDOWN

#### **BACKGROUND SCREENINGS**

All adult staff members require a full background screening that includes the following:

- \* Social Security Number validation;
- \* Name and address history records:
- \* Two independent Multi-Jurisdictional Criminal Database searches covering 50 states plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;
- \* Federal District Courts search for each name used and district where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable:
- \* County Criminal Records for each name used and county where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable for each county searched:
- \* National Sex Offender Registry database search of all available states, plus DC. Guam. and Puerto Rico;
- \* Multiple National Watch Lists;
- \* SafeSport Disciplinary Records;
- \* Comprehensive International Records search for U.S. citizens who have lived outside of the United States for six consecutive months in any one country, during the past seven years;
- \* Motor Vehicle Records of at least a 3-year history in the state of licensure; (if driving is required for position).
