Officials: Set goals, look for ways to improve

As we head into the start of the club season it's good to be prepared not just with the uniform and whistle, but also have some goals for improvement throughout the club season. Officials are always learning and growing so here are some helpful ways to improve your game.

Read the rulebook and always have it with you. Badger Region just sent out a large number of rulebooks to officials who have purchased their memberships and paid the \$25 ref fee. It does take an hour or two to read the abridged version and you won't retain everything however it will help when you need to go back to navigate and find a specific rule.

Be open to mentoring and critiquing yourself during and after matches with honest feedback. The game can be a great teacher so open yourself up to mentoring and even play back a recording of yourself officiating a match and go through it by yourself or with a mentor. Act on critiques if you see a pattern and don't be afraid to ask questions and reach out to fellow officials.

Be a mentor and use what you have learned to teach new officials. Teaching others is a great way to learn and reaffirm skills.

Attend officials clinics and use those opportunities to learn from others, get to know your colleagues and ask questions. You can learn a good deal of information from clinics and they often bring a different way of thinking and some things you've never thought of before. Officials of all levels are excellent resources.

Watch officials from different sports either on TV or in person. This is obviously not to learn the rules of volleyball, but it can be used to watch how other officials carry themselves. You can also watch how officials interact with coaches and athletes before and during a match/game or how they handle conflict and diffuse high-stress situations. Take these helpful tidbits of information and apply them to your craft.

How do you prepare yourself for tournaments?

A common question from new officials is: "What advice do you have for getting through my first tournament"

Response (and good reminders for veteran officials):

* **Be prepared** and control what you can control. The "off court" preparation is key to getting through your first tournament. Once on the court and live play, everything seems to flow smoothly.

Hints for preparation:

* Be prepared for long days,

mentally and physically * 8 matches a day is common and **"recovery"** to start day 2 is really important.

* **Get there early,** factor weather, if a new site, parking can be challenging

* Find the tourney director/ host. Get any ground rules, format, etc.

* Pack your own healthy lunch and snacks. Some but not all tournaments provide officials lunches, but packing your own ensures you get what you like and pack foods that you can eat "quick"

* Look the part: clean, pressed officials uniforms and clean crisp signals. Gyms can be cold or hot, bring layers and extra shirt.

* It's winter, **get your car ready**, extra windshield wash fluid.

* **Hydration is key**, the day before and evenly throughout the day and early hydration is more important. Water is the best, sugar drinks not so much for a long day

* Use your time wisely. Eight minutes in between matches goes fast

* Know and be able **adjust to the level of play:** 12's or 18s -- boys or girls.

* Know the rules

* Be a great team player and help out where needed and be a facilitator of the game.

The 'Sport Court' rule explained

The player retrieving the ball over a non-playable area must be in contact with the playing surface when contact is made with the ball.

Meaning: a player cannot jump and leave the sport court and then play the ball when it is over a non playable area (often times the concrete). The player must have some body part in contact with the sport court when contacting the ball over the non-playable area.



BACKGROUND SCREENINGS

All adult staff members require a full background screening that includes the following:

- * Social Security Number validation;
- * Name and address history records:

* Two independent Multi-Jurisdictional Criminal Database searches covering 50 states plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;

* Federal District Courts search for each name used and district where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable:

* County Criminal Records for each name used and county where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable for each county searched:

* National Sex Offender Registry database search of all available states, plus DC. Guam. and Puerto Rico;

- * Multiple National Watch Lists;
- * SafeSport Disciplinary Records;

* Comprehensive International Records search for U.S. citizens who have lived outside of the United States for six consecutive months in any one country, during the past seven years;

* Motor Vehicle Records of at least a 3-year history in the state of licensure; (if driving is required for position).
