Last Chance Tryout a huge success for clubs, athletes

The Badger Region hosted its second Last Chance Clinic & Tryout following the high school tryout period on Nov. 17 at the New Berlin SportsPlex, and the feedback staff has received has been fantastic.

One parent sent the following email: "My daughter said that was the most fun she had at a tryout in her 4 years playing club volleyball. She said if Badger Region had a club she would definitely tryout for them."

Representatives from nine clubs were in attendance to make offers and evaluate the 40 girls ages 15-17 in the gym that evening.

"We received 12 accepted offers from athletes who attended the event," said one club director.

It was a great way to collaborate with clubs, too.

"We really liked being able to help the volleyball community — clubs and families alike — to make sure everyone found a home or had a chance to fill their rosters," said program director Brian Sharkey.

A similar event was held Oct. 9 following the 14-and-under tryout period that was attended by 12 clubs from throughout the state of Wisconsin.

Access your junior ref modules

Each year, the Badger Region requires clubs to train their coaches and youth athletes to line judge, score, libero track and be a second referee. The Badger Region will not withhold an athlete from competition if the training is not complete, but can sanction the club if it has not fulfilled requirements. Clubs have the option to let coaches and athletes take online modules to satisfy their requirement, or clubs can bring in a certified official to train in person.

If your club allows you take the online modules, use the following steps:

- 1. Log in to Sports Engine.
- 2. Click on "household" in the left rail
- 3. Click on the "tile" of the coach/athlete who will be taking the online modules
- 4. Click "view details" on the Badger Region tile under the coach or athlete's profile.
- 5. Click the USAV Academy button at the top of the screen.
- 6. Click "Content Library" in the left rail and search for the "junior" modules

athletes, coaches and officials thrive in and the damage that a negative environment can have in so many different ways. Sportsmanship and creating positive and safe environments for participants - many of whom are children - to succeed in, is the foundation of the mission of Badger Region, and our partnership with Won80 puts the words into action.

Won80's sportsmanship summits (many of which are about 60 minutes in length) are hands-on, high energy and engaging. They also contain relevant topics that coincide with thought-provoking and empowering messages. Horbinski also is able to work with clubs to collaborate and customize his presentations for specifics groups.

"We're currently working on plans to be able to share information and action items to those who are interested, and also reach those who need it the most but maybe don't know it or acknowledge it," Armson-Dyer said.

The Badger Region Board of Directors has set aside funds to allow a handful of clubs to experience a sportsmanship summit put on by Won80 during the 2022-23 season. The Region also hopes to host a virtual Lunch & Learn for families who would like to participate in the program. A modified in-person

option is also being planned for the weekends of the Badger Region Championships for parents and families.

University Athlete a benefit to all players

For any Badger Region athletes participating in our marquee Badger Region-hosted events (Champs/Qualifier/Power League) as well as other out-of-state qualifiers, we want to encourage you (or your sons & daughters) to fill out a FREE University Athlete profile to help your son or daughter get recruited.

University Athlete is a great way to allow college coaches access to your information free of charge. How does it work? College coaches can download rosters from AES (the software that runs most tournaments) and put it on their devices where they can then add notes, ratings and see your schedule. The college coach is the one who pays for the service -- not the athlete or the tournament host.

University Athlete is the industry standard. And it doesn't help the athlete if he or she doesn't have a profile in the

system

Curtis Madson, a collegiate coach and Badger Region Board Member agrees.

"As an athlete this is the easiest and one of the most beneficial things you can do. Everyone talks about and are worried about what events they attend so that they can be noticed, but as a college coach there is nothing more frustrating than noticing you as an athlete and not havin any information to contact you with," Madson said. "This is a free service to you as the athlete, that almost ALL college coaches at these events use. If you want to put yourself out there, and give yourself the best opportunity to be recruited, PLEASE fill out the profile and provide an email at a minimum."

All adult staff members require a full background screening that includes the following:

- * Federal District Courts search for each name used and district where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable;
- * County Criminal Records for each name used and county where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable for each county searched:
- * National Sex Offender Registry database search of all available states, plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;
- * Multiple National Watch Lists;
- * SafeSport Disciplinary Records;
- * Comprehensive International Records search for U.S. citizens who have lived outside of the United States for six consecutive months in any one country, during the past seven years;
- * Motor Vehicle Records of at least a 3-year history in the state of licensure; (if driving is required for position).

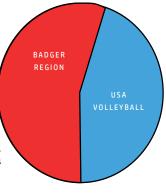

G14-17s headed to Dallas for nationals in 2025

USA Volleyball has selected Dallas, Texas, to host the 2025 Girls Junior National Championship (GJNC) for the 14-17 age divisions. The tournament will take place June 25-July 3 at the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center.

"We are excited to be returning to Dallas for the 2025 Girls Junior National Championship (14-17)," said USA Volleyball President and CEO Jamie Davis. "Dallas is a vibrant and multicultural city with a wide variety of restaurants and attractions. The city is always happy to host our athletes and their families and fans."

USA Volleyball is splitting the Girls Junior National Championship beginning in 2023 and having one tournament for the 11-13 age divisions and one for 14-17. This creates more competitive opportunities for athletes and clubs and increases the number of venues that can host.

"Dallas has an extensive event resume with USA Volleyball events," said Monica Paul, Executive Director of the Dallas Sports Commission. "This announcement shows that our future will continue along that trajectory. It is an honor to partner with USA Volleyball to host the 2025 Girls Junior National Championship (14-17)."

The GJNC is the United States' premier junior girls club tournament and attracts college scouts from across the country. There



are now seven competitive divisions for each age group in the 14-17 divisions, and the 2025 tournament is expected to draw more than 1,200 teams.

Many of the nation's top college recruits and members of the U.S. Women's National Team have competed in this event as a part of their junior careers at the club level, with several going on to compete in the Olympic Games. Among the U.S. Women's National Team players who have competed at GJNCs are 2020 Olympic gold medalists Micha Hancock, Chiaka Ogbogu and Justine Wong-Orantes.



How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they

think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.
