USAV unveils online coaching academy

USA Volleyball has announced the launch of the USA Volleyball Coach Academy, an online, interactive learning platform for volleyball coaches.

The launch of the new platform came on the first day of the 2022-2023 membership season and offers clubs and coaches new tools as they prepare for the season.

The Gold level allows coaches to access live virtual sessions. These sessions let coaches connect, ask questions and dig into advanced topics with top volleyball experts. The first two live sessions will be completely free.

Access your junior ref modules

Each year, the Badger Region requires clubs to train their coaches and youth athletes to line judge, score, libero track and be a second referee. The Badger Region will not withhold an athlete from competition if the training is not complete, but can sanction the club if it has not fulfilled requirements. Clubs have the option to let coaches and athletes take online modules to satisfy their requirement, or clubs can bring in a certified official to train in person.

If your club allows you take the online modules, use the following steps:

1. Log in to Sports Engine.

2. Click on "household" in the left rail

3. Click on the "tile" of the coach/athlete who will be taking the online modules

4. Click "view details" on the Badger Region tile under the coach or athlete's profile.

5. Click the USAV Academy button at the top of the screen.

6. Click "Content Library" in the left rail and search for the "junior" modules

The Badger Region has announced ages at which it will field teams for the 2023 USA All-Star Championships taking place in July of 2023 in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

Badger Region High Performance All-Star teams being offered by the Region will be as follows:

* Girls U17 — formerly International Youth (Born in 2006 and 2007)

* Girls U15 — formerly National Select (Born in 2008, 2009)

* Girls U13 — formerly Future Select (Born in 2010, 2011)

* Boys U19 — formerly National Youth (Born in 2004 and 2005)

* Boys U17 — formerly National Select (Born in 2006 and 2007)

Families should note that the Region will now be offering a U13 girls division for the first time in program history.

To comply with FIVB international age definitions that changed this past year, boys age definitions have also changed for the competition



that will take place in the summer of 2023.

Tryout dates for both the boys and girls program will be announced in the near future.

In 2022, the Badger Region came home with two gold medals at the USA All-Star Championships held in Tulsa, Okla.

University Athlete a benefit to all players

For any Badger Region athletes participating in our marquee Badger Region-hosted events (Champs/Qualifier/Power League) as well as other outof-state qualifiers, we want to encourage you (or your sons & daughters) to fill out a FREE University Athlete profile to help your son or daughter get recruited.

University Athlete is a great way to allow college coaches access to your information free of charge. How does it work? College coaches can download rosters from AES (the software that runs most tournaments) and put it on their devices where they can then add notes, ratings and see your schedule. The college coach is the one who pays for the service -- not the athlete or the tournament host.

University Athlete is the industry standard. And it doesn't help the athlete if he or she doesn't have a profile in the

svstem.

Curtis Madson, a collegiate coach and Badger Region Board Member agrees.

"As an athlete this is the easiest and one of the most beneficial things you can do. Everyone talks about and are worried about what events they attend so that they can be noticed, but as a college coach there is nothing more frustrating than noticing you as an athlete and not having any information to contact you with," Madson said. "This is a free service to you as the athlete, that almost ALL college coaches at these events use. If you want to put yourself out there, and give yourself the best opportunity to be recruited, PLEASE fill out the profile and provide an email at a minimum."



As a benefit to members (clubs, parents, fans, officials and athletes), the Badger Region will work to coordinate Won80 with clubs who are interested in receiving a free sportsmanship presentation from founder Mark Horbinski, a longtime teacher, coach and official in Wisconsin for over 30 years.

Horbinski's grassroots movement called Won80 is on a mission to lead a return to sportsmanship through awareness, education and inspiration. His presentations encourage participants to focus on their own behaviors and action that will in turn allow everyone to positively impact teammates, teams and communities alike.

"I'm very excited about what could come out of this serendipitous meeting with Mark from Won80," said Badger Region Executive Director Jennifer Armson-Dyer. "From our discussions, we share the same vision about the positive environments that athletes, coaches and officials thrive in and the damage that a negative environment can

participants – many of whom are children – to succeed in, is the foundation of the mission of Badger Region, and our partnership with Won80 puts the words into action.

Won80's sportsmanship summits (many of which are about 60 minutes in length) are handson, high energy and engaging. They also contain relevant topics that coincide with thought-provoking and empowering messages. Horbinski also is able to work with clubs to collaborate and customize his presentations for specifics groups.

"We're currently working on plans to be able to share information and action items to those who are interested, and also reach those who need it the most but maybe don't know it or acknowledge it," Armson-Dyer said.

The Badger Region Board of Directors has set aside funds to allow a handful of clubs to experience a sportsmanship summit put on by Won80 during the 2022-23 season. The Region also hopes to host a virtual Lunch & Learn for families who would like to participate in the program. A modified in-person option is also being planned for the weekends of the Badger Region Championships for parents and families.



How is the Badger Region Board structured?


The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fouryear terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
