USA Volleyball-hosted events seeking officials

Registration for nationally owned events are open for officials to register with for the coming spring and summer.

This year, officials who work a minimum of three USA Volley-ball-owned events will receive a \$500 bonus.
One of those events must be either GJNC 11-13s, GJNC 14-17s, or BJNC.

2023 enhancements:

- * Match Pay: \$40 National/JN; \$36 Regional; \$34 Provisional
- * Parking: Provided/reimbursed up to \$20 per day. This would cover overnight parking at one location only (hotel or convention center).

- * Food: Snacks/water
- * Food Voucher: \$20/day
- * VIK: You will receive a jacket and USAV Mizuno Certified Officials Polo
 - * Housing: Double occupancy housing

New position being hired for events

A new "position" is being developed for Badger Region-hosted events (Power League, Championships and Qualifier)

The Badger Region Officials Assigner will be assigning a handful of "bullpen" officials during the larger Badger Region hosted events.

The information listed below is intended to give officials who are assigned as a "bullpen" official an idea of the types of duties that they may encounter during a shift or a day. This list is not all-encompassing and may include "other duties as requested" during the tournament, so the ability to be flexible and willing to help is a necessity.

Some likely responsibilities will include, but won't be limited to:

- * Fill in on court to officiate if official is sick or behind schedule, which causes a shift of courts (This may be one to many matches during the bullpen assignment).
- * Fill in as the R2 for on court matches to assist the R1 official as needed
- * Run score sheets to and from court, particularly for courts behind schedule or officials with a long day.
 - * Assist officials with online score entry if used.
- * Assist head official with protests (run through process ahead of time)

- * Score monitor/float around facility and check on work teams
- * Fill in for a work team (score, R2, line) if needed
 - * Organize / straighten up the referee room
 - * Help in pit with medals, questions, etc * Possible mentor for newer officials
 - (assigned by Sara Voigt)

 * Hand out score sheets at championship table, as needed and for the first match of day.

To be successful as a bullpen official:

- * Must be comfortable officiating all skill and age levels, and boys and girls
- * Must have a high level of rule knowledge for questions and protests
- * Must be self motivated and flexible to work a variety of tasks
- * Must be a good mentor and bring a claiming helpful demeanor to assist officials in challenging, tiring situations
- * Must always be available and easy to find by the tournament director and assignor and not distracted.

Bullpen officials are paid the match fee based on the wave of court grid including built in break, etc. Example 6 match wave, official would get paid 4-5 matches

Officials can set up direct deposit for Region events

Did you know that if you work the Badger Region's marquee events that you can be paid with direct deposit through our accounting company?

Yes. You can.

Independent contractors who work the Badger Region Championships, Qualifier, Power League and Dale Rohde Memorial can set up a profile and account and get paid via direct deposit.

To set up an account through

Bill.com, click here.

The system will ask you some questions so follow the prompts. You will also be asked to confirm your email address (and phone number if desired).

Once confirmed it will prompt you for more information. At the end you will be asked for your bank routing information for online bill pay

The monies worked while officiating, scoring or serving as

a lead official, score monitor, etc., can then be deposited electronically. A paper check would not be sent.

Through this system, deposits are made roughly three days after they are processed and approved.

BACKGROUND SCREENINGS

All adult staff members require a full background screening that includes the following:

- * Social Security Number validation;
- * Name and address history records:
- * Two independent Multi-Jurisdictional Criminal Database searches covering 50 states plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;
- * Federal District Courts search for each name used and district where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable;
- * County Criminal Records for each name used and county where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable for each county searched:
- * National Sex Offender Registry database search of all available states, plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;
- * Multiple National Watch Lists;
- * SafeSport Disciplinary Records;
- * Comprehensive International Records search for U.S. citizens who have lived outside of the United States for six consecutive months in any one country, during the past seven years;
- * Motor Vehicle Records of at least a 3-year history in the state of licensure; (if driving is required for position).


MEMBERSHIP COSTS BREAKDOWN
